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THE DANGER OF COMPLACENCY

To be complacent is to have a feeling of quiet pleasure, contentment or satisfaction with oneself because of some level of achievement that has been made. Complacency is often very evident in the lack of zeal and dedication in laying claim to God's wonderful gifts. This study will focus on how to identify complacency with the aim of eliminating it in our lives, why Christians are complacent, and dangers of complacency.

HOW TO IDENTIFY COMPLACENCY

- (a) Lack of inner motivation Josh. 18: 2-3 The seven tribes were half-hearted in their commitment to claiming their inheritance. There was apathy, lethargy, and indifference.
- (b) There are always 'good' excuses to be stagnant and non-progressive. The lazy believer is often full of excuses, Prov. 24: 30-31; 22:13
- (c) There is a false sense of security and therefore a lack of concern for the situations around them where they live or work, i.e. Hezekiah in 2 Kings 20:
- (d) They are usually immature and committed in their spiritual lives or the growth of Gods kingdom where they are, Lk. 18:1 8
 - (e) They are indifferent to God's word James 1:22-23
 - (f) They are lukewarm Rev. 3:14-19
 - (g) They lack self-examination Acts 24:16
 - (h) They lack foresight Pro. 29:18

WHY PEOPLE BECOME COMPLACENT

- (a) Discouragement caused by failure encountered in the task Num. 21: 4-5
 - (b) Delay in fulfilment of desires Pro. 13:12
 - (c) Difficulty of impending task Neh. 4:10
 - (d) Unrealistic expectations of themselves Pro. 23:77; Rom. 12:3
 - (e) Feeling of inferiority Gal. 3:28
 - (f) Worldly pleasures 1 Jn. 2:15

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THE DANGER OF COMPLACENCY

- (g) Little material possession Matt. 6:33
- (h) Achievements Rev. 3: 17; Lk. 12: 16-21
- (i) Lack of total repentance 2 Sam. 11: 2-17; 12: 1-7. David became insensitive to the Lord as a result of his deliberate repeated act of living in sin.
 - (j) Let us add to the list.

DANGERS OF COMPLACENCY

- (a) Neglecting fellowship with the Lord and brethren Heb. 10:24;
 - (b) Slow or delayed progress Heb. 5: 14
 - (c) Bondage to Satan's agents Exo. 1:14
 - (d) Poverty 1 Sam. 2:7
 - (e) God's judgement 2 Cor. 2:5
 - (f) Lack of fulfilment in life Gen. 49: 3-4
 - (g) A damaged conscience 2 Sam. 12: 10-14
 - (h) Other areas complacency may affect:
 - i. Secular Job Rom 12: 1-2
 - ii. Family Life 1 Tim 5:8; Eph. 5:22-25; 6: 1-5 iii. Leadership - Gen 39:2-4, 22
