So, why don't you set our homepage as one of your **startup page(s)** in your browser now? The following instructions for most of the common browsers may help.

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Have we learnt the lesson of faithfulness?

Text: Micah 6:1-5

There are issues of trust for our politicians and ultimately, a couple faces questions of trust when they stand before the altar. In our text, God was teaching these people of his faithfulness and he questions if he can trust us! Have we learnt the lesson of God's faithfulness? Do we trust him enough to yield control to him? Do we trust God with everything?

Negative people (examples in the bible) are people that do not trust in God. When Elisha said by this time tomorrow there'll be food, somebody says even if God opens heavens that'll not happen! Elisha said because of his lack of faith he'll see but not partake! However, when Jesus fed the 5000 - he ordered the 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish to be served. God needs us to trust him; that's why Christ asked: Do you believe I am able to do these things?

The lesson God has been trying to teach us since we gave our life to Christ is to trust him! David said of God: You are the fountain of life, the life by which we live (Psalms 37:23-25). Be fearful of the one that can kill both body and soul in hell (Matt 10:28)!

Handling the passage of time:

Believe he will bring it to past.

The passage of time may make us doubt. But remember, God made a promise to Abraham in his 70's and although Abraham decided to follow his wife's advice, God delivered what he promised. Everything the scripture talks about, including salvation of our souls will come to past! Time shouldn't get us to a point where we doubt God's promises.

We could preserve as much as we can, but rest assured this world will come to an end. Remember, the Scripture doesn't like excess. For example, when he fed the 5000, Christ says gather the rest so nothing goes to waste.

He says my righteous one will live by faith. We should keep our hope that the future would come to past. We may doubt, but we must remember God is a faithful God. He makes us a candidate to enjoy his underserved mercy.

Bottom line:

God must guide us because he can see the end from the beginning. So, let's learn the lesson of faithfulness. Let's know that faithful is he; all his work with Israel was to teach them and us about his faithfulness.

As we walk with God, he will keep us in perfect peace because we trust in him. Our prayer should be that we completely learn to trust him ... right to the end.
