

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Gospels

Text: 2 Samuel 11 / 2 Samuel 12

Michael fought with the angels and he overpowered them. Satan, "the accuser of our brethren, who accused them before our God day and night", was thrown out of heaven (Revelation 12:7–10). Disasters happen. We're sometimes like struggling fish in water. But we overcome "by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of [our] testimony".

In the book of Luke, the angel said there are glad tidings, putting the focus on Christ (Luke 2:10). In John, they were confused about Christ. Some wanted him arrested, some thought he was who he said he was - The messiah (John 7:37-52). At his cross, when the soldiers witness the earthquake and all that had happened, they paid attention and declared him "the Son of God" (Matthew 27:54).

Nobody met Jesus with their lives and choices remaining unchallenged. He had an answer for everybody. Different laws affect different people. If you are conservative, you tend to want less taxes and if you're liberal, you most likely want the opposite. However, Christ came for everybody, regardless of their background. He came to save their souls.

Nobody spoke like Jesus (Mark 4:24-25). There was no one like him.

Pay attention

There are distractions in the world. But we have to pay close attention to those four gospels. Accepting his words will change your life (Mark 4:11-12). Instead, they scoffed at him (Mark 6:2-3).

Bottom line:

Jesus was sent to show us the way, so that we may know "the only true God" (John 17:3). A lot makes us worry – keeps us up at night. However, Christ wants us to sit at his feet and learn from him like Martha did (Luke 10:42).
