

#### Mozilla Firefox

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### How to build a church that is healthy, growing and full of love

Text: Eph 4:11-16

This year and for the rest of the decade, our theme and focus will be on the latter part of verse 16: "He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love."

As we all know, the church is not a building but each of us in it. Our growth and health depend on each other; each part doing its work. **George Barna**'s book titled "**The Habits of Highly Effective Churches**" has a number of metrics for identifying a growing and healthy church, including the following:

- Focus on strategic leadership: Emphasising accountability and transparency in our practices.
- Focus on **praying**: If we delight in praying, no one needs to cajole us to attend prayer meetings.
- Focus on worshipping: Worshipping is more than singing. John 4:23 tells us
  we must worship God in spirit and in truth, acknowledging God in every area
  / aspect of our lives.
- Focus on **people released intentionally into ministry**. There's something unique each of us can contribute to the church. Elisha was able to help the desperate widow woman by using a jar of oil she already owns. The oil later filled several jars; as many as the woman could get and no more. Regardless of how rich or poor you are, you still have something to offer God: your voice, empathy, encouragement, mentoring etc., and a lot of our programmes fail sometimes because we are not thinking about who can benefit.
- Clear vision and mission. Often, we're good at outlining what we want to do with clear plans. Vision is the resolution; mission is the plan.
- Coherent discipleship plan. The focus must NOT be on programmes but on people.
- Service to the needy. Most of Jesus' ministry was devoted to serving people in distress.
- Healthy finances: How we're using church money is crucial. It's not about accountability to the charity commission but to God in all decisions and allocations.
- Experience of the move of the Holy Spirit. If we must succeed in anything, we cannot do it without the Holy Spirit's help.

#### **Bottom line**

The book of Ephesians could be a blueprint for a church that is focused on achieving Jesus' purpose. As a church, we have one message that is never changing but the mode and methods of passing on the message will change with time, and must be fit for the purpose and the season.
