

Google Chrome

- Open the browser and the Settings menu (or the three vertical dots to the right of the menu bar).
- 2. Scroll down and click on Advanced Settings.
- 3. Select Open a specific page or set of pages under On Startup.
- 4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add http://rccgbethel.church/.

Mozilla Firefox

- Open Firefox. Press Alt-T on the keyboard and select Options from the drop-down menu or go to Tools >> Options from the main menu.
- 2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.

Microsoft Edge

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The book of Ephesians – A walk through

It was written by Paul and the core message is that we're blessed with every spiritual blessings in heavenly realms and with every resource we will ever need. However, we sometimes don't avail ourselves of all we've been given. It is like a passenger upgraded to first class who refused the FREE service because of the likely cost.

The book can be broken into two parts. The first three chapters is about our position in Christ and establishing solid doctrines. The last three chapters is about our actions and lifestyle. As a result, we're well positioned. So, it is the intention of God to place us where we are, but what are we doing with the resources we've been given?

Our current position is outlined in chapter one:

- God chose and blessed us to be of use to him (v3-5).
- We've been adopted. Therefore, we are privileged (v6-8).
- We're predestined. Salvation is not just for the Jews (v9-11).
- We're marked with a seal and the promise of the Holy Spirit (v13).

In brief, chapter two recounts our positions before we came to Christ. We were doomed / dead, but God made us alive in Christ (v1-5). We became God's masterpiece, created to do good works ... what he's planned for us ... for him. There's a purpose to our lives (v10).

Chapter three talks about the mystery of our salvation. In four, we learnt we're part of one body (v16). Five tells us how we should respond ... we must walk in the way of love (v2). In the final chapter, we're encouraged to stand firm and we've been given the resources to: the amour of God, belt of truth etc.

Bottom line (Eph 3:20-21):

God can use us far beyond our expectations or thought, if we let him. This is so others can see and be drawn to him. Note that you can have all the power, but it'll be of no use if not utilised.
