FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In-filling of the Holy Spirit

The baptism of the Holy Spirit is not just about speaking in tongues. We see examples of the baptisms in Acts 2:1-4 or when Peter was at Cornelius' house (Acts 10:44-46) or Paul in Ephesus (Acts 19:1-6). In each of these cases, they did speak in tongues. Does that mean if you don't speak in tongues, you're not baptized? Speaking in tongues could be a feature, but that's not all it is about.

What is the evidence of Holy Spirit baptism?

In the memoir of Charles G Finney, he talked about receiving a mighty baptism of the Holy Spirit without seeking it, as he was about to sit. He described it as a wave of electricity. No tongues, but this experience was proven by what he did from that point on. So, the **fruit** of the spirit is an important clue.

Can someone become a Christian and not have the Holy Spirit?

All Christians have a measure of the Holy Spirit when they gave their lives. It is by him we're sealed and no one can come to Christ without having a measure of the Holy Spirit. However, there's key difference between in-filling of the Holy Spirit, which empowers a believer, and speaking in tongues.

It is like going to a buffet restaurant which offers a fixed price that entitles you to all you can eat. Some take enough portions to allow them to sample everything. Others pick favourites. They will all pay the same price and that's part of the calculations.

Christianity is the same. The same price has been paid for all of us, but not all will avail themselves of all that is available. We need to open ourselves to the in-filling. You can either go through the effort of kindling a fire or go to someone who already have a kindled fire. But do not avoid the in-filling of the fire of the Holy Spirit. That takes you asking and his manifestation when you do, may or may not be accompanied by tongues. It could also be different from other experiences.

In Luke 11:5-13, Jesus said: If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!

Why did Jesus link gifts to children with the gift of the Holy Spirit? Because it is the one gift we should persist in asking for. The one gift that manifests in a 'before and after' experience.

Bottom line:

We need a continual re-filling every day. The gifts are for the church and that actually includes speaking in tongues (1 Cor 14:1). But Holy Spirit is for the believers. He's our personal enabler and the proof is when we begin to bear the fruit of the spirit.
