FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

United with Christ by grace

Text: Ephesians 2:6-10

We learnt weeks ago that although we have several things or people that can influence us e.g. social media celebrities, the devil and so on, grace is a greater influencer in our lives (Eph 2:5). In our text today, we're told God saved us in Christ, not because of anything we did, but by grace. Our first (original) position is death and God raised us from that position. This means we died and rose with Christ.

When we died with Christ, we were buried with him. Everything we were, including sin etc., was buried with him (Gal 2:20). When we rose, they're gone. We're raised to life and are now reunited with Christ. As a result, we became an example, a **masterpiece**. This was only possible because of grace.

What does it mean to be united with Christ?

A **masterpiece** is carefully crafted and precious. That's what we've become. It means we've been grafted, just like it's done in plant cultivation, taking on the nature and character – everything Christ is (Rom 11:17-18). We're no longer who we were before and we no longer 'own' ourselves, but share in the rich nourishment in the body of Christ. In other words, we're one spirit with him (1 Cor 6:9-17).

It's like being in a marriage; no longer individuals 'apart' and we shouldn't be talking about him or us as though we're separate entities (Gen 2:20-22). As in a marriage, the benefits in the union comes from what each person supplies (Eph 4:16). The difference is we brought nothing good into the union with Christ and gained everything. He makes all that he is available to us (Rom 5:5-6; 11).

For example, the umbilical cord supplies everything a baby needs when in the womb. It is said that the mother passes on all the antibodies she has to the baby before birth and that sustains the baby. In the same way, Christ passed on his antibodies to us. That is grace, because normally, we go into unions for what we can gain from each other.

We may ask then why it is that we're still unable to stop sinning. We can only stop by faith and we need grace for that too. It is by faith we've been saved (Eph 2:8). If we're still sinning, we're frustrating grace and aren't allow it to do its work in us. In other words, we set it aside, forgetting we're no longer alone or own ourselves (Gal 2:21). That's like being given access to a bank account and rejecting it, struggling to make ends meet.

Bottom line:

Today, take time and sit at Jesus' feet. Let it sink into you that you've been grafted into Christ and he's passed on his nourishments and antibodies into you. Jesus spent time confirming that at the end of his time on earth (John 14:16-17; 25-26; 16:12-16). Also, know that without the Holy Spirit, grace cannot be effective in your life. At the heart of grace, there is that crucial relationship.

This is reflected in 'the grace' affirmation we share at the end of each service. As we're locked down, spend time to develop a deliberate relationship with the Holy Spirit. Find quiet times to talk to him about anything you want. At first it may seem strange, if it's not something you're accustomed to doing, but in time you will find you've developed a worthwhile relationship.
