Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.

Microsoft Edge

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What should Christians' attitude be about politics?

Some might say we shouldn't mix politics with religion i.e. state is state, church is church and both should be miles apart and separate. However, we can't get away from politics.

Politics simply means how a group of people govern themselves, from basic self-governance to dictatorship, democracy, autocracy and so on. People tend to gravitate towards someone who becomes a leader within a group of bodies such as schools, churches etc., and would follow them, sometimes to a fault.

What does the bible say about politics / authority?

Terrible leaders may cause lots of problems for the people they lead. However, God ultimately rules over all (Prov 29:2; Dan 4:17). God asked us to submit to all authority. Jesus did, recognising the authority of the ruler of his day (1 Pet 2:13-14; Matt 22:15-22). So, the bible does not condemn politics.

What should our approach be?

First, we must submit to all authorities and that includes whether they're good or bad (Rom 13:1-3). Some have used Acts 5:29, where Peter and the apostles declared they must obey God first to support disobedience. But these are not in opposition to each other. Governments may get it wrong, but we must open any rules and regulations, pay our taxes and get involved.

We should spend time to pray (1 Tim 2:1-4) for our leaders to get it right and for God to send us the right kind of leadership. Leaders do not have to be Christians to take Godly decisions and Cyrus is an example in the bible (Isa 45:1, 4; see also 41:2-25; 42:6; 2 Chron 36:22-23).

God can use anyone and prayer can turn anyone's heart (Prov 21:1-9). There are also several other examples in the bible, of characters involved in politics e.g. Joseph, Esther, Mordechai, Nehemiah, Daniel and many others. Politics is interwoven with all our lives and with great impact too. Therefore, we must participate.

If inclined to, join a political party. Otherwise, ensure you educate yourself about their manifesto and policies, then vote your choice. We cannot sit on the fence or abdicate our civil responsibilities as Christians. We must aim to influence the world by our words and actions (Matt 5:13-16).

Bottom line:

Daniel was always relevant because he carried his faith along with him wherever he went. Pray that our leaders will make the right decisions that will benefit the people. It is not easy to be in leadership. They need our prayers and our cooperation.
