Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Beatitudes

Text: Matthew 5:1-11

We've heard several sermons over the years, some sticking with us for a long time. The Beatitudes may have been one of the most striking, taught by Jesus himself.

Someone said the beatitudes reveal blessedness is spiritual, not so much what a man has or can get or otherwise. Similar blessings are pronounced in Deuteronomy 28:1-28, including on physical objects. Jesus talked about nine categories of characters worthy of a blessing.

They include those that are humble, the mourners or those who grieve, the meek, the merciful which also means to be compassionate. Jesus told the parable of the Good Samaritan to illustrate what it means to be merciful (Lk 10:30-37). The question is can we see ourselves in any of them?

Agabus once prophesied that there'll be a great famine and everyone among the believers sent relief to those affected (Acts 11:27-29). We see here how several were affected by merciful acts from afar.

As Christians, we must take every opportunity to be merciful and be a blessing to others. When we do that, experience tells us it is one of the important ways the love of God can be spread around.

Bottom line:

Therefore, let us be merciful when we can, because Jesus said when we do that, we will be shown mercy too (Matt 5:7).
