Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Preparations belong to God

Text: Philippians 3:12-16

Paul admitted in this text that even he is a work in progress, and only relying on the grace of God. But he finishes in verse 16 by saying we should continue to "**live up to what we have already attained**." In Contemporary English Version, it is translated to say we must keep going in the direction we're already following.

In other words, we may not be perfect yet, but the things God has already given us victory on must be consolidated. We cannot keep fighting the same battles over and over again. Sometimes we get so frustrated with where we are and what we can / cannot do, and become depressed (Jonah 4:1-3). Instead of consolidating on what we've already achieved and press forward, we begin to feel we're ineffective or failing.

When God has set us free from a bondage, Jesus said it is final (John 8:36). How do we keep ourselves from becoming demoralised with disappointments? How do we consolidate on the gains we've already achieved? Sometimes we become discouraged because we're not prepared. We see this in the Israelite's exodus. All they ever knew was Egypt. They were so unprepared that they only had dough to bake unleavened cakes. But then, we see how God worked to release them from bondage (Ex 12:37-39; 41-42).

This shows that it is not about how prepared we are. It is about what God can do through us (Psa 31:16). Even when we think we're not prepared, God has already made preparation ahead of us (Pro 16:1). We only have to trust in God. For example, the warriors of Israel were prepared for the Philistine called Goliath, but had no courage to fight him. Yet, David, with nothing but faith in God and a sling shot defeated him (1 Sam 17:1-54).

When we face challenges, let us not despair. Think back to the times God has already saved us from similar or other problems and press forward in trust that if God did it once, he can do it again. That's what it means to consolidate on the gains we already made. It is what David learnt from God's deliverance from the lion or bear when they attacked his father's lamb. That gave him the confidence to face Goliath (1 Sam 17:34-37).

The word of God has the solution to every problem we could ever have. Immerse yourself in his word, pray without season and trust in God, and as we continue to pray and trust in God, he will help us again. Note that God shows up in a mighty way, when things seem impossible or beyond us. It makes it easier to know it is God that has done it (Jdgs 7:4).

Bottom line:

It takes a measure of trust to continue forward when we're not prepared. But when we place our trust in God, we need not fret. When we fret and worry incessantly, we're just showing we don't trust in God.
