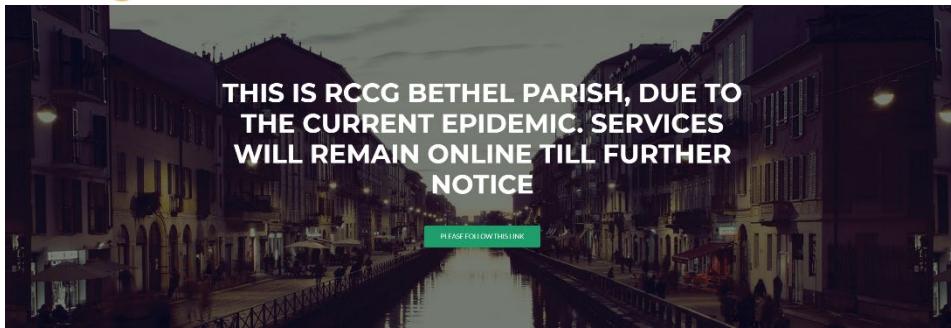

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God's divine economy

Text: Philippians 4:14-19

This text is often used to pressure people to give more, but we can see that Paul needed the support they gave him. He acknowledged that they were the only one who partnered with him, suggesting it was voluntary. There was no pressure put on any of the other churches to support him. Finally, Paul concluded with attribution to God for the provision and prayed that God will supply their needs too.

For example, God commanded the raven to bring Elijah food by the brook (1 Kn 17:3-4). When the brook dried up, God asked Elijah to go to a widow and although the widow had very little to spare, she was persuaded to share it with Elijah (1 Kn 17:8-9). Likewise, on the day of his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, Jesus told his disciples where to find the colt he would ride (Lk 19:30-34).

Jesus also supplied the food and room to celebrate Passover in Luke 22:7-12. In Matthew 17:27, he provided a silver coin for his disciples to pay tax through a fish. These examples suggest that God is able to provide all our needs, but it also means we're all stewards of his provision and we can be called upon anytime to be a channel of blessing to others (Matt 25:23).

We must understand that everything we have is not ours. They're given to us so that we can dispose of it as and when God asks us to. We should also know that when we obey, God will supply our needs, just like Paul told the Philippians (Phil 4:14-19). This is not about getting back what's offered, be it money or time or other valuables. It is about God knowing what we need and giving them to us, like he did for Elijah.

We can save for the future, but if and when God calls upon us to use it in other ways or when we see a need around us, we must be ready and willing. It is the only response when we know that everything we have is from God (1 Cor 4:7). These include our wisdom, intelligence, strength, power, wealth and so on (Ecc 9:11).

Bottom line:

Jesus once told his disciples in a parable that to whom "much is given, of him shall much be required" (Luke 12:48). Keying into God's plan and purpose guarantees God's provision in our lives, but it also means we're tapped into God's investment plan.
