

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The portrait of Jesus: Unremarkable arrival

Text: Matthew 1:18

Continuing our series on the portrait of Jesus today, it is clear now no one can pinpoint when Jesus was actually born and there's a chance he wasn't born on the 25th of December. For Christians, this season should be a commemoration. It may be curious to notice that the day of Jesus's birth was unremarkable too. A day just like any other, with no fanfare to announce his birth or celebrate it.

In fact, although he's the King of kings and Lord of lords, John said he came unto his own and they rejected him (Jn 1:11-13). He was born in the lowest of places, in a manger and there's historical accounts suggesting the wise men did not even arrive with their gifts until long after he was born. For example, Herod's killing after the wise men visited him was when he was around two years old (Matt 2:16).

The angels were astonished, heralding peace on earth to all men. They couldn't keep the news to themselves and had to proclaim it, but only to lowly shepherds (Lk 2:8-10). It is the day of the Lord, when God became man and reasonable to expect some funfair, but there was none.

However, another day is coming that cannot be missed (2 Pet 3:10). Jesus warned against being deceived by big and deceitful witnesses (Matt 24:3-7; 9-10). Until today, when unusual events occur, we wonder if it might be the end. Jesus said there may be plagues and rumours of war, but the end will be just as unremarkable as his birth was. He also prophesied that even the elect may be deceived.

Jesus emphasises this by referring to Noah's day. So many were busy enjoying banquets and celebrating weddings. None of them knew till the floods came (Matt 24:36-44). We can see that the love of many of us are growing cold even now, just as he predicted (Matt 24:12). Like Elijah found, the coming of the Lord may only be like a gentle whisper (1 Kn 19:11-13).

As we commemorate his birth during this season, think about that last day. Where will you be? Let's be prepared and not get distracted. Jesus performed great miracles and yet, many didn't believe him. Today, we have technologies achieving and creating feats of innovations and likewise, reaching more people than we can ever imagine. Yet, many are becoming immune to the message of salvation, rejecting Jesus all over again.

Bottom line:

Contend for the faith entrusted to us by Jesus (Jude 1:3). Don't let the world or events or circumstances take it away from you.
