

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.

Microsoft Edge

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dealing with failure

Text: 1 Thessalonians 2:1-3

Today, we'll be talking about failure. Paul stated in the above text his visit to the Thessalonians wasn't a failure despite how badly they were treated at Philippi (Acts 16:11-40). To some, his experience in Philippi will be considered a failure and Paul could've believed that too, stopping him from continuing his missionary journeys. Instead, he declared God gave him courage to preach boldly, despite "**great opposition**" (1 Thess 2:2b – NLT).

This may make us wonder what is considered a failure. Is it an event, a series of events or a state at a certain point in life? What performance indicators do we look at? If it is in business, do we look at the profit margin? Even if a company runs at a loss for a while, as long as it's got projections and indications of future profit, it may be considered successful and in time, it could be.

The story of Lazarus and the rich man is a curious one. When Lazarus was on earth, some may consider his life unsuccessful as a beggar. Even as a beggar, Lazarus doesn't seem very good at it, because the scripture said he was so hungry he ate scraps of food given to dogs (Lk 16:19-31). However, when he died, his life was transformed. In contrast, the rich man's experience was the opposite (2 Cor 4:17; Lk 12:13-15).

The writer of Ecclesiastes explored this at some length, with some debatable conclusions (Ecc 6:1-9). He declared that it is enough to enjoy whatever status you find yourself in, as long as God gives you joy in your heart (Ecc 5:18-20). Risk averse individuals and those who count costs excessively, based on what they can see or current circumstances, may often find they accept defeat before it happens.

That could lead to self-fulfillment of what's expected, including in athletics and business (Hab 2:2). This suggests there may be great reward in taking risks or steps in faith at times. Our impact on others may be more important to some than the grandness of whatever platform we own, even if they only impact a single life.

Bottom line:

How do you measure success and failure in your daily living? Do you often base your judgement on current circumstances or your abilities instead of what God can do through you? If so, it is time to change that, knowing that you may never know the full impact of your life on others.
