Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Hope

Text: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-10

Is it possible to live without sin? That is a question we come to again and again, over time and the answer for us is yes. It is possible to live without sin for us Christians, because when we accepted Christ as our Lord and Saviour, we take on his nature (2 Cor 5:17). Our nature has change and we no longer have the sinful nature (Gal 2:20-21; Rom 8:11).

Some challenging things have been going on today, especially in the UK. It may feel a bit like the world is upside down. All of these are having a profound and devastating impact on our lives, our standards of living and it is global. Our text today talks about times and seasons. They affect all of us. There are times of rain and sunshine. Wisdom may suggest we prepare for them.

That's why we're told to be keenly aware of what's wear going on and wear a protective armour to preserve our salvation (1 Thes 5:8). However, there are times we can't and they come upon us suddenly. The bible says God has not saved us to pour out his anger on us (1 Thes 5:9 – NLT). That's the start of our hope today.

Hope can often take us a long way. It assures us things will get better, but the truth is, it is not fact or certainty and better or good times may never come. Also, when we have to put on our armour in the hope of salvation, it may feel like assurance is not guaranteed, but in Christ Jesus, it is (1 Thes 5:8). For Christians, hope is not a strategy, but the only strategy, especially when there's no logical reason to hope anymore (Rom 4:18).

That's why Paul told us not to live like people without hope (1 Thes 4:13). It is the reason we make any effort, because when we live in despair, we give up (1 Kn 17:12). God's faithfulness never ends and his mercies are renewed every morning (Lam 3:1-3; 16-18; 20-23). That's why Paul says he still had hope (1 Cor 15:19).

In these hard times, believe in hope, hold on to the word of God for your life. Don't waiver from that, no matter what. Let your hope and faith get stronger. Like Abraham, have the confidence that God who have promised will bring it to pass (Rom 4:18-21). These time and season may be hard, with high cost of living and so on, believe it is not an accident. It isn't to God. Tell yourself it is your time and your season to triumph and thrive.

Bottom line:

Even when there's no reason to hope, keep hoping, knowing that believing in hope means you know it's going to get better (Rom 4:18).
