Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Portraits of Jesus – The Samaritan woman

Text: John 4:1-42

Around this time of the year, we take a more in-depth look at the life of Jesus and our focus will be on the Samaritan woman today. We don't know her name, but she met Jesus while fetching water at about noon on a very hot day. If we reflect back to how hot it was last summer, we may be able to understand how Jesus felt. So, it wasn't a surprise that Jesus wanted a drink.

However, the woman recognised Jesus is not only a Jew, but a man. In historical context, they shouldn't be talking to each other and she wanted to know why Jesus was talking to her. The disciples wondered about that too. **The Pulpit commentary** have the following to say about their reaction (John 4:27-38; <https://biblehub.com/commentaries/pulpit/john/4.htm>, paraphrased).

The disciples returned with their provisions and marvelled that he was talking with a woman. They didn't ask what the woman wanted, only why Jesus was talking to her. How could he not know that was wrong and isn't the expected behavior? Such a proceeding was contrary to the etiquette of a rabbi, who contended that "a man should not salute a woman in a public place, not even his own wife" (cf. Lightfoot, Edersheim, Wettstein). One of their daily thanksgivings was, "Blessed art thou, O Lord... who hast not made me a woman" (Westcott).

The commentary added that one of the miracles of Jesus's ministry was to break down the rabbinical prejudices against the spiritual capacities of women, supposed to contaminate their sanctity. Jesus lifted women to their true position by the side of men and were his most faithful disciples, ministering to him, sharing his miraculous healing, feeding, and teaching. They anointed his feet, wept over his agony, followed him to the cross, went early to the sepulcher, greeted him as the risen Lord and received the baptism of the Spirit. In Christ there is neither male nor female (Gal 3:28).

It surprised the woman that Jesus chose to speak to her, but she received something tangible from the encounter. Something she took with her and relayed to everyone in her village, testifying that **"He told me all that I ever did."** Jesus stayed with them for two days and they came to believe too.

Bottom line:

No one has a right to God speaking to them. Yet, he speaks to us all the time and sends his word to us in the flesh. He still gives us his word today, through Jesus Christ who dwelled among us (Jn 1:14) and through others. The word of God is still one of the greatest gift of God to man today.
