Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Resisting the lie

Text: 2 Thessalonians 2:1-12 (NLT)

Last week, we concluded that every day is the Lord's Day (2 Thes 2:1-3) for us to rejoice and be glad (Psa 118:22-24). However, when Paul talked about the Lord's Day, he was referring to one in particular and he elaborated on that in the next verses. We talk a lot about the world we're in now, but the whole purpose of the church is to prepare us for the world to come, also known as the end of days. This is often a challenging topic.

Paul told us not to believe the Day of the Lord has come. Not until there's a great rebellion and the man of lawlessness is revealed. The book of Revelations describes the beast and the miracles he performed. It is said he and those who follows him can be identified by a mark on their forehead and the number 666 (Rev 13:11-18).

The concepts outlined in the book of Revelations may be challenging to read at times, but we may be able to identify some of what's described happening right now, especially in financial terms. Often, many are unable to buy or sell without verifiable cards or accounts with numerical identifications. But when Paul said the man of lawlessness will sit in the temple of God, claiming he's God, which temple is Paul referring to (2 Thes 2:4)?

The book of Corinthians tells us our body is the temple of God (1 Cor 6:18-20). How does it feel to think the man of lawlessness will replace God in our bodies and in other words, our minds, through lies and deceit? The truth is challenged constantly today and often those who profess lies can be aggressive in forcing others to believe their falsehoods. These are the days when we must be careful and make sure we're holding onto the truth (Prov 23:23).

There are certain truths we used to accept universally. They include the fact that having sex outside marriage is wrong. But today, that's questioned. There's nothing wrong with that. We're told to question everything, even in the bible (1 Thes 5:21). However, this text cautions us to make sure we're not among those being deceived and often, we don't know we're deceived until our eyes are opened.

The book of Proverbs talked about two women, Wisdom and Folly. Wisdom prepared food and wine and issued invitations, but most didn't respond. They would rather accept Folly's stolen water and bread, perhaps because she described them as "sweet" (Prov 9:1-6; 13-18, NLT). The book of Proverbs says there's no point trying to rebuke or correct those fooled in this way. They will only resist and hate those who do (Prov 9:7-8, NLT).

Jesus came for only one reason, to do God's will (Heb 10:5-7). Is that the same with us? We all enjoy the miracle of sight and comprehension, both in physical and spiritual terms. We can only pray that those that cannot see and are being deceived will gain their sight (Jn 9:39). It is true that we can go through life focused on the wrong things. That's a form of blindness and it takes divine sight to see through a lie (2 Cor 4:3-4; Jn 16:13). Jesus is truth. We must seek him at all cost, even when challenged.

Bottom line:

More and more, what we consider the truth is being tested and the boundaries pushed further and further. We must make every effort to reject lies. Seek and hold onto the truth.
