

Google Chrome

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Don't be afraid to stand out

Text: 2 Thessalonians 3:14-15

These verses may be challenging for some. Paul makes it clear here that anyone in the church not obeying the directives in his letter should be shunned and made to feel ashamed. We may agree it's a form of cancelling, a culture popularised and despised in the society today. This verse shows it isn't a new concept. Preachers may sanitise what they say on the pulpit sometimes or we may choose to disinvite or excommunicate a Pastor who violates or preaches something we consider heretical.

Paul was talking about people who steadfastly refuses to listen or respond to admonishment or correction. Paul had something similar to say about those indulging in sexual sins (1 Cor 5:9-11). It may seem harsh, since God is love (1 John 4:7-21) and uncomfortable, because texts like these don't sound inclusive or seem too uncompromising. Some religious practices are known for their rigid obeisance to doctrine, envied or criticised by some for it, but they make no apologies.

Often, Christianity is open to interpretation and we debate everything. However, we should understand that doesn't take away from what Paul is trying to avoid, the fact that the words we hear and our beliefs will always produce an action or result. Whether we're aware of it or not, we become what we believe in time (Rom 2:11-13; 10:17).

When we actually become the word of God, it is impossible for us not to stand out because it is about order (Rom 12:1-2). That's why Jesus said the world hates those who have accepted the word of God (Jn 17:6-14). The problem is we don't like to stand out. Instead, we try to conform because the world attack those who are different.

Paul was trying to avoid the point when permissiveness, inclusivity or indulgence becomes conformity with sin and the world. That's why we must be careful about the words we listen to and the companies we keep. We must ensure we don't allow them to change us.

Bottom line:

Stand strong in this generation. Don't be afraid to stand out and be careful about what you listen to as well as your associations.
