Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

How do you convince others about the resurrection?

Text: 2 Peter 1:14-18

Very few people know when it is time for them to die. There's a sense in this passage that Peter knew he was close to the end. He testified about what he saw and experienced with Jesus. We've read many of these stories in the Gospels and may find some difficult or less than convincing. Peter said his experience convinced him.

There's no way we can be convinced about Jesus and the Gospel. We've probably heard most of the logical arguments against and some are eager to make them (1 Cor 1:18). Just like Peter, there's only one way to be convinced. Peter heard Jesus's voice and couldn't be shaken. We must hear him too and experience the power of his resurrection, and it is not an experience everyone will be privileged to undergo.

Paul's experience was remarkable, including an audible voice (Acts 9:3-6). Many of us have diverse experiences and we may have mocked those preaching to us prior to them. For some, it's during a service. Others, it could be during the most devastating event in their lives, when there's a before and after, a reference point in their lives. However, the one common theme is that everything will make sense from that point on, when each of us hear his voice.

Today, we're celebrating a God that is resurrected and a life that is changed. Like Paul, knowing this God is the most crucial thing (Phil 3:10-11). A day's going to come when each of us will die, but that is not the end. Whether we believe or not, there's a resurrection coming. The question is, where are we going to end up? Are we walking "**a new and living way which he consecrated for us**" (Heb 10:19-22)? It is most crucial that we hear that voice and we are.

Bottom line:

Have you heard his voice? Do you know him? If you haven't and you don't, this is the time to pray earnestly that you can and thereafter, be convinced of his resurrection.
