FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Knowing God beyond reputation

Text: 1 John 1:1

Last week we focused on the living word according to John. During our Sunday School session this morning, we were talking about what to say if asked about homosexuality or anything the Bible calls a sin. This is somewhat related to what we'll explore in this verse again today. Jesus told us not to worry when we're brought before kings (Mk 13:11). We may find Jesus's reactions to people who came to him a couple of times curious. He was welcoming in one and less so in another (Jn 1:35-40; Matt 8:18-22).

What's the difference? It may be because one of them was a Scribe and Jesus knew their core motives. When John talked about seeing, looking upon, handling, knowing and touching the Word of life, the first thing to say is that God is the one that gives us permission to handle, know or touch him (Psa 27:8). This is expressed in one of the songs we sang this morning. God is beyond understanding ("Almighty God" by Tim Hughes).

There's a joy that belongs to people God chooses to bring near to him (Psa 65:1-4). How do we know a God like this? Maybe that's why Paul prayed for comprehension of the "width and length and depth and height" (Eph 3:18). How can we touch a God that cannot be contained? We may begin to see the limitations in thinking we can convince people to following God. We rely on our senses e.g. seeing, touching etc., to know someone. What do we know of God and how do we tell others about him? The Bible says creation tells us about God (Rom 1:20-21), but how do we describe him to others?

Jesus once asked his disciples what the people and later, his disciples say about him (Matt 16:13-20). He knows some only testify of him by reputation. How about you? Do you only know of him by reputation or in truth? If you know him as a Saviour or healer, has he saved or healed you? Peter's response was commended by Jesus as a revelation from the Holy Spirit (Matt 16:16-17). We can only know God by experience, when he allows us to.

It is when we experience God as the solution giver that we can find solutions in the word of God. That's when the word of God becomes living and breathing and how we can obtain peace from reading a verse when troubled (e.g. Phil 4:7). If we're not careful, all we really know of God is what we've been told and not what we've experienced. Jesus posed this conundrum to his disciples (Matt 22:41-46). Paul's convinced (2 Tim 1:11-12). Are you?

Our senses question the illogical. So, we must go beyond them to learn how God speaks to and reaches out to us. This could change from time to time too. God is beyond our understanding and he knows his plan for each of his creation (Jer 29:11). We cannot pigeonhole God. So, we must go God beyond the letters of the Word and reputation. When he chooses to let us, we must get away from talking about the God of Abraham etc.

Bottom line:

We must know God for who he really is. That's when we can get revelations from the word of God to sustain us. Like Moses, let's pray that God will show us his glory (Exo 33:18-23).
