

Google Chrome

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Pure light

Text: 1 John 1:4-5

1 John 1:5 says "God is light, and there is no darkness in him at all." We know total darkness is impenetrable and difficult to see through (Psa 119:105). Some of us may need that sort of environment to be able of sleep, waking up when the light is switched on and it penetrates the darkness. In the Western World, true darkness is always difficult to find because there are various types of light sources everywhere we turn and dispelling darkness is one of the first problems God solved when he created the world (Gen 1:1-3).

God is light. If there's no light and without the spiritual light from God, we're in darkness and can't see (Matt 6:22-23). We sometimes assume everyone know what we know, but that's not a realistic expectation (2 Cor 4:3-4). How can we describe a God who is light and indescribable, whose voice shakes mountains (Ex 19:9-25; Heb 12:26-29)?

There are degrees of light or illumination (Eph 6:12), but God's light is purest form and at times, when he comes to us, he shields himself to limit the impact of his presence (Acts 9:3-5; Ex 33:18-22). He also speaks to us in a way we can understand (Joel 3:16) and his light cannot and should not be hidden (Matt 5:14-16; 4:12-16).

However, whether we realise it or not, before we knew Christ, we were in total darkness and can't see or comprehend his ways, until God shines his light into the darkness of our lives (Eph 2:8-10; Isa 55:8-9). That is the good news. When we go through challenging times and think there's no solution, a light can come into our mind from the word of God, penetrating the darkness (Ps 42:1-11). Then, we begin to see and solutions can come to us.

God is always working in our lives. However, when darkness is prevailing or present, we often can't see what God is doing. So, the good news for us today is that "God is light, and there is no darkness in him at all" (1 Jn 1:5). If there's darkness in our lives, we need to let God dispel it and trust that the present darkness around you, if any, is not able to stop his light from shining through. The challenges may persist, but our perspectives can change.

Bottom line:

We are God's masterpieces and created to do good works (Eph 2:10). He's removed the darkness in us and replaced it with illumination. A light so pure it swept the darkness away (2 Thes 2:8). So, ask yourself the question: Am I in God's light?
