

Google Chrome

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Walking in spiritual light

Text: 1 John 1:6-7

Our text today says we're not truthful about our fellowship with God when we persist in living in spiritual darkness. The good news is that God is light. So, it follows that we're not with God when we're not in the light. We may understand we need an unbroken fellowship with God, but do we know it's a three-way cord, linking us with him and with one another?

It may be worth exploring what fellowship actually means or how God cleanses us from sin at another time. Today, the emphasis is on remaining faithfully in the light. Even when faithless, the scripture says God remains faithful, because he cannot do otherwise (2 Tim 2:12-13). That was why Jonah refused to obey God and warn the people of Nineveh. He knew God is merciful and will forgive them if they repent. God cannot deny himself and Jonah knew that too, but had to be reminded he cannot hide from God.

The people of Nineveh also know about God's mercy and they became penitent. How do we reconcile that with what our text says today, reminding us that we lie if we remain in darkness and say we fellowship with God? We often see death as final or terrible and we sorrow and grieve. How does that fit in with what Jesus told Martha, that whoever believes in him will never die (Jn 11:25-26)? We either believe that and rejoice or be sad.

However, the true tragedy is when we live a lie throughout our whole lives, when we're spiritually blind or live in the darkness. The text today implies that sin has forms and is not one-dimensional. One manifestation of sin is distress (Lk 7:48-50; Psa 51:3-4; 7-9). As Christians, we're in distress when we do not live in the reality of God's grace. Sin also paralyses us or make us go round in circles (Mk 2:5; Psa 51:3; Deut 2:1-3).

God never changes and never lies. The scriptures emphasises that God does what he says, especially when he swears by himself (Num 23:19; Heb 6:15-18). Before Peter saw Jesus, his reality was that they were at risk and about to sink in the middle of a storm, until Jesus walked on water to him (Matt 14:22-33). When he saw Jesus, Peter left his reality and begin to walk on water too, even when the storm never stopped and was still raging. In fact, Peter began to sink only when he took his eyes off Jesus and began to live a lie.

How often have we focused too much on our reality, instead of focusing on Christ? The good news is God doesn't abandon us even when we're faithless, because he remains faithful (Matt 14:31; 2 Tim 2:12-13). When we believe in the persecution we face everyday even in societies where we worship freely, we're living a lie and need to lift our eyes to Jesus who's the truth and our light (Jn 14:6). God who removed the "filthy garments" from Joshua and scores like him have and can do the same for us too (Zech 3:1-7).

Bottom line:

In the sermon on the mount, Jesus enjoined us to reject the way of the world (Matt 5-7). We must take our eyes off the storm of our lives and live in the reality of the light of God or we live a lie. It is not enough to believe the truth. We must practice and live in it (1 Jn 1:6).
