Google Chrome

- Open the browser and the Settings menu (or the three vertical dots to the right of the menu bar).
- 2. Scroll down and click on Advanced Settings.
- 3. Select Open a specific page or set of pages under On Startup.
- 4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add http://rccgbethel.church/.

Mozilla Firefox

- Open Firefox. Press Alt-T on the keyboard and select Options from the drop-down menu or go to Tools >> Options from the main menu.
- In the Home section, select Homepage and new windows and Custom URLs... from the field's drop down.
- Enter or paste the URL: http://rccgbethel.church/ or click Use Current Page if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

- 1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
- Select Settings and select A Specific Page or Pages from the Open Microsoft Edge With section drop down options.
- 3. Enter http://rccgbethel.church/. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
- 4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

How do we promote unity among believers?

Text: 1 John 1:7 (AMP)

Our discussions have explored unity or disagreements in the church at large and between denominations. Now, we will concentrate on fellowship among ourselves and it is interesting that the directive in our verse today starts with "if" in Amplified version, suggesting it's conditional. That may strike us as strange since it is our expectation that believers walk in the light. Unity in fellowship should be normal for us Christians.

Unity is important for our gatherings to be successful (Ps 133:1; Amos 3:3; 1 Cor 1:10; Matt 12:25-26). When we focus on God as our father and guide, a perfect unity should be the hallmark of our relationship with one another (Jn 17:21-23). How could there be any disunity among us (Phil 4:2-3; Js 4:1-2)? What do we see as our responsibilit(ies) to each in our churches? How do we want to be remembered?

Paul and Barnabas had a disagreement and got over it long enough to work together (Acts 15:36-41; 11:25-26; 1 Cor 9:6). What's stopping us and why do we have disagreements with each other? Disunity occurs when we step out of the light in our individual walks with God.

If we can avoid that and live in the Spirit, we will bear the fruit of the Spirit and love one another as Jesus love us (Gal 5:22-26; Jn 13:25). Another problem we may have with each other is envy, comparison and pride. We should avoid being envious or comparing our situations with someone else (2 Cor 10:12). Forgiveness is also important. Let's stop bearing grudges, be humble and admonish in love (Eph 4:15).

Bottom line:

If we walk in the light and exhibit the fruit of the Sprit such as love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness and so on, there will be unity in our fellowships with one another. As we're enjoined to live in peace with each other (Rom 12:18), be humble. Lay down your right to be right and take up the cross of Christ.
