

Google Chrome

- Open the browser and the Settings menu (or the three vertical dots to the right of the menu bar).

- 4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add http://rccgbethel.church/.

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The complete package

Text: 1 John 2:1-2

Today is Father's Day and our Father in heaven's the world's greatest Father of all. In our text today, John reassures us Christians that we have an advocate with the Father, even if we sin. However, he stressed that his goal is that we do not sin, having testified to the one they've seen and touched. John said he's the word of life and by nature, he's light and there's no darkness at all in him.

In contrast, our nature tends to the flesh and only our soul is regenerated. So, if we say we have no sin, we like and make him a liar. When we try to judge others or ourselves, we're never objective and either too harsh or too lenient. The only true judge is God. The same's true for children and their fathers. Their opinion of each other may be flawed or distorted. Children's impressions of fathers may not match what their father thinks and vice versa. That may be why someone said: "Birth is agony. Life is hard. Death is cruel."

Some may find Christianity easy because it is a way of life and not a set of rules (Col 2:20-23). Paul reminded us that if keeping the law makes us right with God, there was no need for Christ to die (Gal 2:21; see also Matt 25:31-46). When we aim to follow a set of rules, we fail more often than not. Husband and wives starting out by following rules, often based on what they've grown up to believe, may find they can't sustain their marriage by a set of rules. Adjustments and compromises are necessary to build their new life together.

Therefore, the law was not intended to be the focus, but to teach us what's right and wrong, summed up into two by Jesus (Matt 22:36-40). It's about our relationship with God and one another. Fathers and Children disappoint each other all the time, but our love for each other should overcome the conflicts, bringing us closer together. In the same way, the love of God binds us together and our relationship is enriched for it when we practice that love.

The love of God for us is everlasting with no expiry date. It's unconditional and never ends (Jn 13:1). Father's love for their children should be the same and so is a husband and wife's for each other. There's a secular belief that staying married to someone you no longer love is worse than cheating on them. However, a love that's not based on rules or burdensome guilt should endure through the challenges.

Thus, relationships cannot be sustained with rules and our love for each other and should reflect our relationship with God. He's our father and our relationship with him may've been expressed best in Proverbs 8:30-33. God delights in us and our achievements. He's our cheerleader, just like parents delight in their children and encourage them to succeed.

Bottom line:

God's love should compel us to respond in love and not sin (2 Cor 5:14-15). But even when we do, that love remains faithful and boundless towards us and never fails. Today therefore, let's cast down any weight of guilt or bitterness we may be carrying in our relationships, forgiving one another, just like God forgives us our sin always.
