#### **Google Chrome**

- Open the browser and the Settings menu (or the three vertical dots to the right of the menu bar).
- 2. Scroll down and click on Advanced Settings.
- 3. Select Open a specific page or set of pages under On Startup.
- 4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <a href="http://rccgbethel.church/">http://rccgbethel.church/</a>.

#### **Mozilla Firefox**

- Open Firefox. Press Alt-T on the keyboard and select Options from the drop-down menu or go to Tools >> Options from the main menu.
- In the Home section, select Homepage and new windows and Custom URLs... from the field's drop down.
- Enter or paste the URL: <a href="http://rccgbethel.church/">http://rccgbethel.church/</a> or click Use Current Page if you are already on our website.

#### Microsoft Edge

- 1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## Sabbath Day: God's word in his voice

Text: Exodus 20:8-11

The Sabbath reminds us of the importance of rest and rejuvenation. It is therefore important to dedicate a day of week for rest, spend time with loved ones, engage in activities that can renew our spirit and be beneficial to our physical, mental and spiritual wellbeing. It is also an opportunity for believers to gather together to worship and commune with God, while fellowshipping with each other, engaging in activities that can nourish and help to deepen our relationship with God and strengthen our faith, prioritising our relationship with God.

Jesus said "Come to me, all you who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." True rest—the rest from the mind—is important and that can only come from God (Matt 11:28-30; Isa 26:3). We're commanded to observe the Sabbath in the Scriptures. Sometimes called the Holy Bible or Living Bible, some verses caution against additions (e.g. Prov 30:6), but it may amaze us to know the devil speaks within it too.

While the texts or verses can be interpreted in different ways, we must trust the Holy Spirit for what God is saying to us in his word. He's the only one that can interpret the *Rhema* (Greek term for "utterance" or "thing said") and make God's word come alive in our lives. There are attributes we should look for to determine if God is telling us something. It should give us peace. It shouldn't contradict God's word. There must be a confirmation (Lk 1:28) and it should be possible to confirm it from other people (Lk 1: 41-42).

So, one of the things today's text is telling us is not to idolise work than necessary, in comparison to efforts put into what matters to God. Have you cultivated recognising God's voice and listening to the Holy Spirit? What's he telling you from the word of God? We must ensure that God's unimpeachable word has priority in our lives.

#### **Bottom line:**

God yearns to give us rest and replenish every languishing soul (Jer 31:25). We must strive to enter God's rest (Heb 4:10-11). Beyond that, we should also make God, studying his word and receiving guidance from the Holy Spirit a priority in our day-to-day living.
