Google Chrome

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The drivers of life series: Round-up

Text: 1 John 2:15-17 / 2 Peter 1:2-4

We've explored four of the gifts the Father has given us including the Holy Spirit, peace, understanding and insight, and God's precious promises. Last week, we concluded that part of his precious promises to us is to share in his divine nature and not to try and make him like us. God does not want us to be incrementally better (John 9:25). He wants to change us completely (2 Cor 5:17).

Sometimes we get inspirations and set goals to achieve something. Then we forget about it. If we write them down, we may be able to reflect years later and find we haven't achieved as much as we planned. At those times, the only thing we can do is to forget what's gone and press forward (Phil 3:13-14). For example, Caleb had a dream when he was forty, but it took forty-five years before the dream was fulfilled (Jos 14:7-11).

What are the things faith is prompting you to do right now, as you share in God's divine nature (2 Thes 1:11 NLT)? It is never too late. God's promises will be fulfilled, unless we let unbelief and fear stop us (Mk 6:4-6). For instance, God gave us the ability to forgive sin. He's the only one who can. How many of us can tell someone their sins are forgiven? We may feel that's presumptuous, but we have the power to forgive and release them. In doing so, we release ourselves.

A quotation about capitalists reads: "He intends only his own security, only his own gain, and he is in this led by an invisible hand to promote an end which was no part of his intention." This suggests that even if capitalists did good things, it wasn't their original purpose.

Likewise, when we set goals for ourselves, we're going to change lives even when that isn't our original intention. Therefore, we should pursue our goals for those whose lives may be transformed through us, even if not for ourselves.

Bottom line:

Don't limit the power of God's promises in your life. Do everything faith is prompting you to do, in the power of our Lord Jesus Christ, because night is fast coming, when no one can work (Phil 4:13; Jn 9:4).
