

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The gates of the year

Text: Revelations 21:9-14

Today, we're going to look at the significance of gates. The title of the message's taken from a poem by Minnie Louise Haskins (1875-1957) called **God knows**¹. Gates are one of the most important part of the construction of any house because it is the first line of defence for the occupants. It is also a point of vulnerability and usually well-guarded. To ensure adequate protection, price or expense is no object.

Gates are referenced in a variety of ways in the Scriptures. There are different types and the point of entry may determine the destination. There are gates to get into heaven, described in the last book of the Bible (Rev 21:12-13). Also, gates can be just as vulnerable for the enemy and this fact was exploited by Samson to terrorise his enemies (Jdg 16:1-3).

The Psalmist wrote about the gate of thanksgiving (Psa 100:2-4). Some may choose to go into the New Year through the gate of regrets or frustration. There are those who have given up (Heb 10:39). What gate will you go through into the New Year? What defence do you need? There are internal and external gates. Our mouth, eyes and ears can be essential points of entry into our bodies and lives (Psa 141:1-3; 1:1-2). They can make us vulnerable.

It is often said that there are no original thoughts. The opinions we formed over the years that shapes our lives came from somewhere. They often stem from something we've once read or heard. What principles do you run your life by? From where do we get the ideas we hold as crucial. We need to set a guard over our vulnerable points of entry and ensure they're impregnable, because what we say have the ability to shape our future (Matt 12:36-37).

Bottom line:

Gates can make us vulnerable except those God sets guards over. When God is your defence, the gates of your life are impregnable (Rev 21:22-27). Ask God to set a guard over what you see, hear or say as we proceed into Year 2024.
