Google Chrome

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The state of Grace

Text: Ephesians 2:4-5

We were once dead and he made us alive. That implies that Christ was the only one alive when he came, living among the dead, to make us alive together with Christ (Jn 1:1, 11-14; 11:25). The scriptures said he's the God of the living and not the dead, but we were all spiritually dead and didn't even realise that until Jesus raised us up with him (Matt 22:32; Eph 2:5). Some commentaries described this as being transformed into a "saved state."

The **flow state** is the concept of being so engaged in a particular task at the exclusion of everything else. It is to be in the zone, where time and everything else fades into nothingness. Everything becomes possible and we're most productive, but there's no exact science about how we get there. Job recalled a period like that in his past life (Job 29:1-25). He was on top of the world and everything was working out (Job 1:8).

Likewise, we can be in the **salvation zone**. We experience the joy of our salvation without struggle (Psa 51:10-12) and begin to value and appreciate what it means to be saved. We're joyful and excited to greet the dawning of each new day. Are you saved? Have you experience that? Job lost everything and appreciated what he had. What was life like for you before you knew Christ? Has your life been transformed?

When we fall in love or something monumental happens in our lives, our whole world changes. Some have vivid memories of the "before" and "after", where it happened and so on. The day grace brings salvation to us should be just as impactful. We're often devastated if the object of our affection doesn't return our love. Yet, while we were dead in our trespasses and hated or was detached from God, he loved us anyway and saved us (Eph 2:5).

By grace, life becomes a stream of endless possibilities and our struggles are over. Jesus's work of grace on the cross was total and complete, encompassing every aspect of our lives (Jn 16:33; Col 1:13). Everything becomes effortless.

Bottom line:

We can't appreciate or value the grace of God that brings salvation until we have a full understanding of what's happened. Physically, there may be no change, but inwardly, we should get the sense that we can never be the same again (Psa 23:1-6).
