Google Chrome

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

When did you stop asking questions?

Text: John 3:1-12

Chapter Three in the book of John contains some of Jesus's profound statements. One of them is "For God so love the world ..." (Jn 3:16). Jesus was speaking to Nicodemus, but the entire chapter was really about man and rooted in the creation story. Who was that man? We find him first in the person of Adam. However, man's not just made in the image of God. Man was infused with the three Godhead when God breathed into man (Gen 1:26-27; 2:7).

The idea of God putting his spirit in man was so man can be taught of God. Man was supposed to receive direct instruction from God and respond (Gen 3:8-11). It is one of the most important part of creation and how we share union with God. When we ask the right questions, we receive instruction. In pursuit of knowledge, Nicodemus became a leader among the Jews, but at some point, he realized he wasn't the man he should've been. He'd forgotten where he was going.

When did we stop searching? It's fortunate that Nicodemus knew to run back to Jesus and begin to ask those questions again. Jesus was able to show him the way, redirecting him back onto the right path. Do we just accept whatever comes our way or do we seek and inquire of the Lord how the things revealed will be? David did frequently and God directed his life (e.g. 1 Samuel 23:4-14). Likewise, Nicodemus's questions led him to the concept of being born again.

What important questions should you be asking about the direction of your life? That's when God's sprit will reveal deep and hidden things to us (1 Cor 2:10-15). If we stop asking, other things such as the spirit of Jezebel and worldly systems will soon fill its place (Matt 12:44-45; Hos 4:6). That's when we begin to lose sight of our identity, because that which is born of the spirit is spirit (Jn 3:6).

A lot of young people are directionless today and searching in the wrong places for purpose. The begin to look to created things to fill the empty spaces in their soul. It's tragic because they only have to look inward and allow the spirit of God to infill and teach them again, just like he taught Abraham, passed down to his children and children's children (Gen 18:19).

Bottom line:

We can never stop asking questions of our God because only his spirit can infill and instruct us on all we need to know. Like Nicodemus, that's when we learn more of him, including what it takes to do God's will.
