Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The set time

Text: Genesis 18:1-10

It is interesting that Abraham ran unprompted to the men as soon as he saw them. This may be because he was attentive and must've sensed they were important. He took care of them and fed them. God and his angels have visited him before, with nothing specific (Gen 15:4-5; 17:15-19), but this was a different kind visit. This time, God was specific. It was the appointed time.

Likewise, we may've been praying and waiting on God for something. A time may come when sense something's different. God's appointed time has arrived (Ecc 3:1). We need to be sensitive to those occasions and know God was working behind the scene (Isa 55:6). The same God, at work when Abraham was 75 years-old was still working when Abraham was 99.

God promised to never leave us and he won't. But there's an appointed time. If missed, it can lead to delayed manifestation or lost opportunities (Dan 10:1-3; 12-13). When Elisha gave a prophesy to the Shunammite woman without a child, she was incredulous, but it was her appointed time (2 Kn 4:15-16). We may sometimes feel God is no longer listening or unwilling to help us, but a set time will come when the waiting will be over (Psa 102:9-15).

Bottom line:

Our day of visitation are often unexpected. But it will come because God is always working on our behalf. We must pray that we don't miss it or ignore the signs.
