Google Chrome

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Seeing the invisible

Text: Isaiah 6:1-8

When we deemed someone beautiful or handsome, we're invariably measuring them against a standard we've decided. An incomparable God has no standard by which we can measure his worth. How can we grasp that? We may begin to understand Jacob's bafflement too (Gen 28:16).

When Isaiah saw God, he attempted to describe what he saw and the seraphim who spoke to him. We can assume he'd seen God before, but Isaiah seemed unprepared. He was seeing God in a new light and his response showed the impact of what he saw (Isa 6:5).

This suggests there are levels of sightings and perceptions we can get when God reveals himself to us. Paul's experience was another level he too struggled to explain (2 Cor 12:1-6). How do you see the invisible (1 Tim 6:15-16)? Remember Moses needed to be hidden in cleft of a rock when for his own protection (Ex 33:21-23). Thus, even Moses only experienced a theophany and not the fullest of God (Exo 34:34-35).

Have you seen God? Do you pray to see his glory? The fact is we do see and experience God all the time and sometimes we're unaware. Jesus Christ came to reveal God to us in the fullest sense possible (Jn 14:8-10; Heb 1:1-4; Jn 1:14). Once, he delayed going to Lazarus's aid to reveal God's power (Jn 11:1-44). Thus, we see God in his word, acts and ways.

What level of God's glory do you want to see this year? Or is God hidden from you (2 Cor 4:3-4)? As we begin to see God, we will carry a level of God's authority within us. We can speak / act under his power (Lk 24:49). Also, God doesn't reveal himself without a reason. Each encounter's followed by transformation and / or calling to greater level of service (Isa 6:8). Otherwise, how can the world tell we've seen God, the invisible?

Bottom line:

We may experience God in new lights this year. As God reveals himself to us and calls us to a deeper walk with him or service, what will our response be?
