

Google Chrome

Mozilla Firefox

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The light has come

Text: Isaiah 9:1-2

It was recorded in the scriptures that the prophesy in this text was fulfilled (Matt 4:12-17). One thing about loneliness is it's isolating, setting us apart from others or help, and so can darkness (Eph 2:12). At times, the isolation can be serious, leading to disconnection or even depression. Today's text brings light for those in anguish, in darkness (Isa 9:1).

How do we understand that light? Isaiah saw it as relief from pain and anguish. In another place, he implied the spotlight is now upon us (Isa 60:1-3). The scriptures talk about light a lot (e.g. Matt 5:14-16). It was created to dispel the darkness and the void *in the beginning* (Gen 1:1-3; Jn 1:1-5). In science, there's a measurement called light years: the distance light travels in one year. For instance, it takes over 8 minutes for light reflected from the sun to reach the earth. So, what we see on earth is its past manifestation. The same goes for planets in the galaxy. But what difference should this make in our lives?

In the scriptures, Jesus described light and how darkness can be devastating (Matt 6:22-23). With light comes insight, defined as "the power to see what's not evident to the average man". What do you see? What insight do you have? When we see as God sees, we see beyond the ordinary (Isaiah 8:12). Before Christ we were nothing. Now, he's given us the permission and ability to shine (1 Cor 1:22-30).

Light helps us to understand the wonderful things God has given us (1 Cor 2:9-16). Paul said this knowledge does not come from human wisdom. It is discerned by the Spirit of God which dwells within us, speaking things our minds can't conceive in the physical. It's the light God called forth in the beginning of time, still shining within us. Spiritual darkness brings death and without spiritual light, there can be no life (Gen 2:17; 1 Sam 16:14).

As Christians, we can never be hopeless because there's always something to see. Isaac could only see the wood and the rope, but Abraham saw the provision with the spiritual light within him (Gen 22:7-8). It is the only way we can see God and the reason we can be confident of our salvation (Heb 11:6). Paul said God's made light shine in our hearts and this was Paul's testimony (2 Cor 4:6-9). You can make it yours today.

The wonderful things God gave us are in fact not casual things we can discern or explain. Many are yet to be discovered and we may only recognise others when we need them (1 Cor 2:9-10). When lonely and depressed, it is likely our thoughts created a barrier between us and the light within us (Psa 42:5). At those times, we should let the word of God flood our soul with God's light again (e.g. Phil 4:6-7).

Bottom line:

We're expected to bring light to the darkness of this world, to bring solutions to problems and a joy others will be drawn to (Matt 5:14-16). Are you aware of the wonderful things God has given you and the treasures within you and are you sharing them with others?
