Google Chrome

- Open the browser and the Settings menu (or the three vertical dots to the right of the menu bar).
- 2. Scroll down and click on Advanced Settings.
- 3. Select Open a specific page or set of pages under On Startup.
- 4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add http://rccgbethel.church/.

Mozilla Firefox

- Open Firefox. Press Alt-T on the keyboard and select Options from the drop-down menu or go to Tools >> Options from the main menu.
- In the Home section, select Homepage and new windows and Custom URLs... from the field's drop down.
- Enter or paste the URL: http://rccgbethel.church/ or click Use Current Page if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

- 1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
- Select Settings and select A Specific Page or Pages from the Open Microsoft Edge With section drop down options.
- 3. Enter http://rccgbethel.church/. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
- 4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Personal stewardship

Text: Luke 16:19-21

Globalisation and supply chain complexities may obscure the true nature of exploitations and unfairness in the society. However, it's sometimes the only way out of poverty in some countries to work for companies like Apple. There's still a cost. The question is who pays the price.

As Christians, we can make conscious effort to consider these issues and find ways to alleviate unfairness in the society and our surroundings. It could be a conscious choice we make to live in a way that limits impact on our environment. What does stewardship look like to each of us in a globalised world? Have you considered who pays the price for your way of life (1 Cor 4:7-8)?

The parable of the prodigal son is part of a sequence that also includes the one about the unjust steward (Lk 15:11-32; 16:1-13). Jesus commented that the children of the world are more shrewd and also concluded that we can't serve two masters (Lk 16:8-13). For example, Lazarus wasn't anywhere near the rich man's table. He was at the gate, desiring to be fed with crumbs and the rich man probably never even thought about Lazarus. Yet, it would cost him (Lk 16:19-31).

Do we close our eyes to injustices and unfairness around us or do we do all we can to help the poor (Gal 2:10)? It's a choice and we must learn the lessons of stewardship to be a good steward (Lk 12:15). Some of us measure ourselves by how much we have in our bank account(s) or what we possess. (1 Tim 6:16-19). Let's develop a social conscience and help the less fortunate in our society and when we're faithful, God will bless us even more (Lk 16:10-12).

Bottom line:

Are you a good steward? Do you share from the wonderful things God has committed into your care? Is the Holy Spirit prompting you to do more (Eph 4:16)? Good stewardship is about making every effort to help others and contentment (1 Tim 6:18-19; Luke 3:11; Phil 4:11-13).
