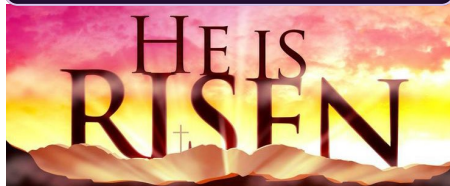

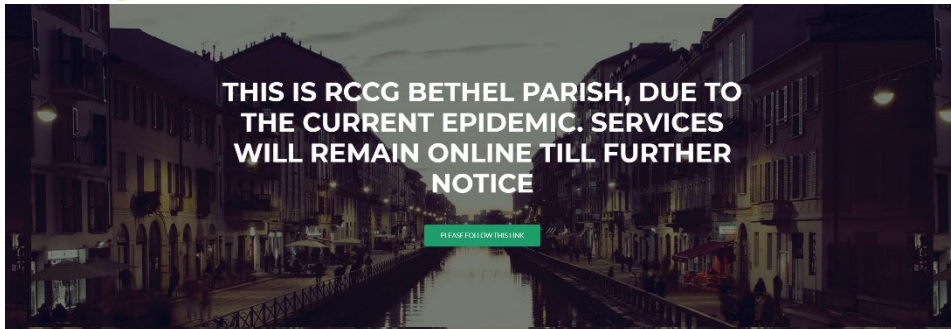

So, why don't you set our homepage as one of your **startup page(s)** in your browser now? The following instructions for most of the common browsers may help.

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The stone is rolled away

Text: Mark 16:1-4

It's been documented there were two earthquakes around the time Jesus died. The scriptures also recorded similar unusual events (Lk 23:44; Matt 27:50-54). These didn't seem to have registered with the two women in today's text. They were more concerned about moving the stone.

Some have described the day they gave their lives to Christ as akin to seismic events in their lives. Perceptions of certain incidents may be different for each of us. How does it compare with other crucial times or milestones in our lives? For some, life may begin to make sense, especially searching for meaning in their existence.

It may feel like there's a massive stone threatening our very existence and it was suddenly rolled away (2 Cor 4:3-4). We've won and there can be confidence of never being seen as a failure again (Jn 10:10). Life has purpose again and there's context for us (Jn 17:3). Thus, Easter may be summed up with one word. Hope.

Bottom line:

Are there stones in your life that need to be rolled away? If you're feeling hopeless or don't have a relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ, ask him to come into your life today. You will find hope and meaning for your life.
