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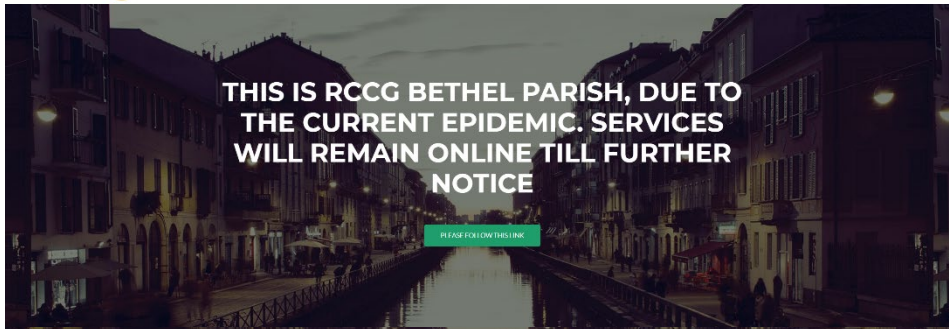

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Kingdom living – Part 2

Text: Isaiah 9:3-7

It may be mind boggling for us to imagine God life span. He existed long before man and time has no meaning for him. To be part of his kingdom, we need to change the way we think. Our hearts must be renewed to be able to conceive the realms of God's kingdom (Rom 12:1-2). For example, have we ever wondered how many kingdoms God ruled?

When we hear about incidents that defies logic, do we find ourselves thinking it's "fake news"? Changing our mindset is a necessity to overcome unbelief too. Jesus once went to his hometown, Nazareth and was only able to perform few miracles. It was a notable exception in his ministry and yet, some were able to receive healing (Mk 6:1-6).

Prophet Isaiah said one of Jesus's names is **Wonderful** (Isa 9:6). It follows that his kingdom should be filled with wonder. Mary was like us, waiting for the last day, but Jesus said his kingdom is already here (Jn 11:23-26). When Manoah met the Angel of the Lord, he asked for the Angel's name, to be sure of the things the Angel told him (Jdgs 13:15-18; Job 5:8-9).

We need to appreciate a God that still does wonder today. The Apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders (Acts 5:12). We know God never changes (Heb 13:8). If that's true, why aren't we seeing more of them today? The fact is we're the ones that changes all the time (1 Pet 1:24-25).

Therefore, if we want miracles, we need to change our mindsets to partner with God. We need to be like Moses and yearn everyday to see God's glory (Ex 33:12-19). Do we limit the boundaries of our walk with God or act in unbelief? When we begin to experience God in unimaginable dimensions, we may find it difficult to convince others of what we know is true. Are we brave enough to step out and prove God's wonderful?

God once showed John the glory of the kingdom to come (Rev 21:1-27). God desires to do great exploits through us (Dan 11:32; 1 Cor 2:9) and we're no different from people who perform miracles. They can see possibilities and take steps in faith. They have passion and desire to see the God of wonders in all his glory (Jn 6:28-29).

Bottom line:

One of the best ways to know the characters of God is to prove him and experience what God can do. God is still performing wonders and the world needs them. He can use us to gift the world the answers it needs and yearns for.
