#### **Google Chrome**

#### Mozilla Firefox

- Open Firefox. Press Alt-T on the keyboard and select Options from the drop-down menu or go to Tools >> Options from the main menu.
- In the Home section, select Homepage and new windows and Custom URLs... from the field's drop down.

#### Microsoft Edge

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### Faith, gender and identity

Text: Genesis 1:27

We've been considering how our faith informs our understanding of gender and identity. How do we approach these complex issues with compassion and grace? What should be our reception to the recent ruling on gender? In the workplace, it can be challenging to handle some of the extreme views with empathy, with tendency to seek to educate / change others.

Often, some things may only be understood when experienced first-hand. For example, what do we do if a much-loved member of our family decides to change their gender? Does that mean we stop loving them? We may disagree with many of the choices made by others, but essentially, nothing's changed about them, except they made a choice contrary to our views. Should we let that single choice define our relationship with them?

The Supreme Court ruling clarified the original intentions for the Equality Act 2010. In the same manner, there's no scripture banning gender reassignment. However, there's clarity on how we relate with non-believers. By first living in obedience ourselves (2 Cor 10:3-6; Matt 7:3-5). That's why Paul told us to work out our salvation with fear and trembling (Phil 2:12).

We cannot conform to the world, but we're on a journey of transformation too (Rom 12:1-2; Phil 3:12-14). When people brought a woman caught in adultery to Jesus, he challenged those without sin to dare cast the first stone (Jn 8:7-11). No one did. Are you about to throw a stone at someone right now? If so, have you checked that your own obedience is complete yet? How are you doing at avoiding the works of the flesh (Gal 5:19-21)?

Many things change over time and our choices become more complex. For example, the scriptures said some will believe lies in the last days (2 Thes 2:11-12). We need the spirit of discernment and ultimately (Heb 5:13-14), our lives should reflect the truth and the life of Christ to those around us.

#### **Bottom line:**

We need to show compassion and accept we're not perfect either. That's why Paul said we know in part (1 Cor 13:9-12). Jesus also made it clear resurrection life may be far removed from our imagination (Matt 22:23-30).
