FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What can you see?

Text: 2 Kings 6:15-23

Salmons are born in freshwater and often return to the same freshwater to lay their eggs. But it's a race against time through an assault course fraught with dangers. On the beaches are gulls and other predators just waiting for the bounty of wayward beached salmons. Once done, Pacific actually die in the same stream.

Regardless, as the tides go out, they begin their journey through shallow waters. No time for eating or resting in between and the journey takes its toll on their bodies too. Survivors look so battered their eye sockets are just empty shells. But it's like they're compelled by something beyond themselves. They'll get to their destination or die trying.

There was a sense of urgency felt by the early church and the Apostles, reading through the book of Acts (e.g. Acts 6:1-4). Jesus demonstrated dedication and warned of dwindling time during his three-year ministry (Jn 9:4). Some of the things that can impede our progress or prevent us from fulfilling our purpose may be beyond our control. Others could be subtle like the circumstances of our birth, sudden tragedy / disasters or fear of failing.

One thing's sure, current difficulties or pain are only temporary, but they could be conduits to seeing and experiencing God in new and / or miraculous ways (Ex 14:13-15; 2 Cor 4:17). So, how do we stop ourselves from giving up too soon? First, we must recognise obstacles for what they are, one of Satan's many ways of tricking us to give up on God.

We also remind ourselves of God's ability to help us (1 Chr 4:9-10), ur focus on getting to our destination without distractions (Heb 12:1-2; Num 14:38; Num 13:30-14:9; 2 Kngs 6:15-23). We're never defenceless (Heb 1:14; see also Isa 54:17; Dan 10:12-14; Lk 12:7) as long as we persevere and never give up (Jdgs 16:28-30; Pro 24:10; 2 Cor 10:4-6; Eph 6:14-18). And we can't be sure of how many chances we'll get (Num 14:29-30; 1 Sam 15:1-5; 10-11; 16:1).

Bottom line:

Obstacles and adversaries may be a given, but God wants us to press forward always (Ex 14:15) and with his help, we can have victory (1 Sam 30:20-26; 2 Cor 4:17-18; Js 1:2-8).
