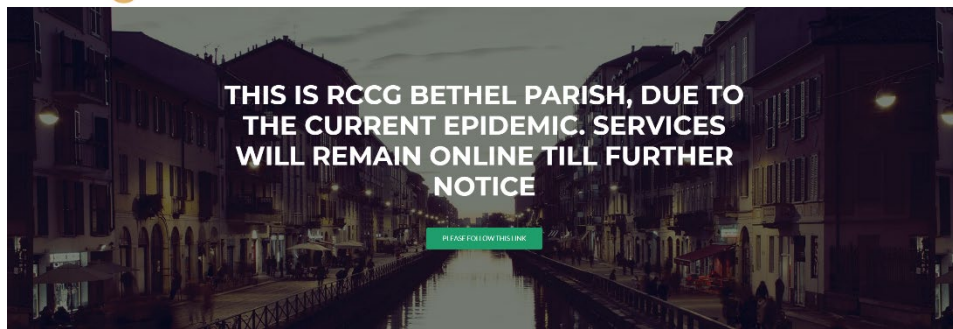

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The ideal father

Text: Joshua 24:15

Happy Father's Day. We know God is the ultimate Father and he loved us first unconditionally (1 Jn 4:19; Matt 23:9). In today's text, Joshua pledged to serve God, along with his household. This can be challenging and the story of the Danites' quest for their inheritance may speak to this. It may surprise us to know they adopted Micah's idol and made Gershom, Moses's grandson their priest along the way (Jdg 18:25-31 NLT).

Eli's children were corrupt and judged God-less (1 Sam 2:12-17). Interesting that Samuel's children too became wayward (1 Sam 8:1-3). Fathers can be a great support structure for their children and many who are fatherless may wish they have one. It is important for fathers to cultivate a great relationship with their children and guide them to serve the Lord.

This places a responsibility on the shoulder of fathers to lead the way in their household as God expects them to (1 Tim 3:4-5). The role of a father may be under severe attack in today's society, but Christian fathers must make every effort not to be discouraged or defeated, because their primary role in their household is that of a priest (Gen 18:19).

Christian women need to empower the men in their lives so they can fulfil their roles. In a lion pride, the female hunt and allow the male to take the larger share of the spoil so they'll be prepared to battle and defend the pride. Likewise, fathers need to protect and shield their children and household from harm, be good role models for their children, strong, prepared and intentional (1 Cor 11:3; Eph 5:23; Psa 127:3-5).

Bottom line:

Don't be the extra child in your household. Be aware there may be no do-over if you abdicate your role. You only get one opportunity to make a
