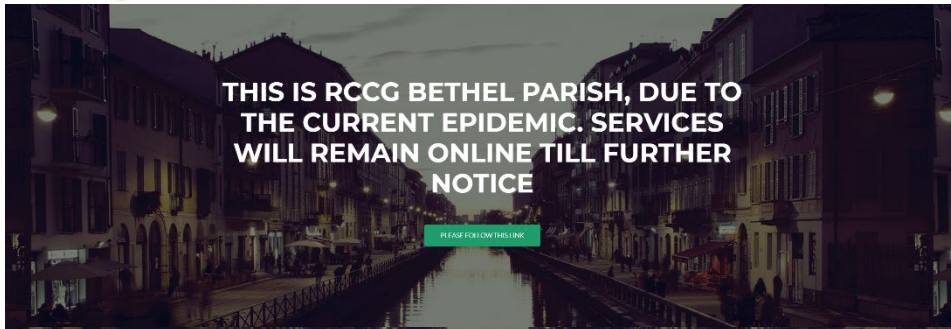

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

His plan, His will

Text: Isaiah 25:1 (NLT)

There's a satisfaction and joy that comes with planning something and seeing it through until it's accomplished as envisioned and we all have a right to claim God as our God. Being able to take ownership of our Almighty Father, as in today's text is special. God can make everything work to our good, including changing laws in our favour (Rom 8:28).

Isaiah went on to say God does wonderful things because he's planned it long ago. Many of us make plans that may slip or change. The end result may be unexpected and durations may be limited. But God plans over centuries and across ages, and he accomplishes his goal.

Therefore, when God plan to bless, he's planned it long ago. God's plan are always long-term. Those he chose to favour and those destined to be objects of wrath were determined long ago (). It's not dependent on anything we do and at times, it may seem as though we're living a charmed life (Jer 29:11; 1:5).

That's because God knew us well before the scientific reproductive process even began (Psa 139:15-16; 1 Cor 2:9). Do you know God's plan for your life?. If you don't, you may find you're stumbling through life just like Paul when he was Saul of Tarsus, kicking against the goads or living contrary to God's plan (Acts 26:14 ; Eccl 3:11).

In life, there'll be mountain top experience and there'll be valleys of despair. What keeps us going through them is know God has a plan for us and while God is able and faithful to accomplish his plan, we must be sensitive to his divine will for us (Isa 46:9-10; Psa 119:105).

Bottom line:

Jesus had the confidence to face the cross because he knew it was part of God's plan that he's sacrificed for our sins. If you don't know God's plan for your life, it is time you seek his face and find out.
