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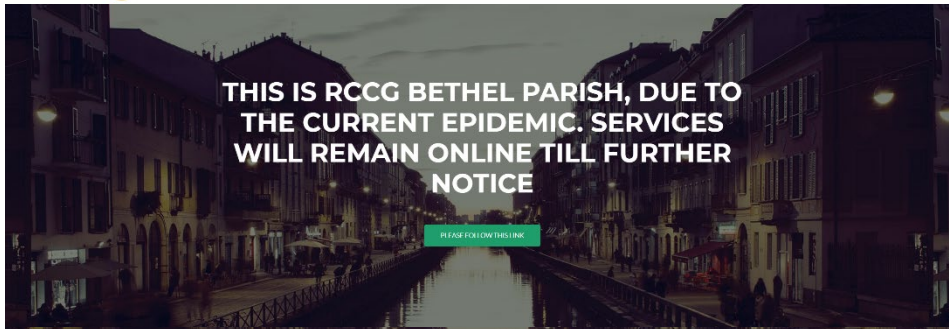

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In that day

Text: Isaiah 25:4-5; 8-9; 26:1-4

You may be asking, "What day?" A lot can happen in a day and the story of creation is a good example (Gen 1:2-5). In fact, everything happens in a day, including change (Job 14:14). The Israelites were in slavery for decades, but everything changed for them in one night, while they were about to observe the Passover meal (Exo 12:1-51). Thus, their history changed from generations in bondage to freedom within a single day. Some speak with confidence or arrogance about an issue like slavery because they've never experienced it.

For David, that day is "***the day the Lord has made...***" (Psa 118:19-29). It suggests a day can be what we make it. For instance, our cultural day last week was as we planned it: a day of rejoicing in our diversity. In the same manner, we can declare a day of mourning, defeat, failure, dread etc. We can also decide it's the day we snatch victory from the jaws of defeat, like David did when he confronted and defeated Goliath (1 Sam 17:1-50).

We all understood a day is twenty-four hours. However, Peter said a day is like a thousand years and a thousand years is like a day and yet, one day is reserved for judgement (2 Pet 3:4-8). We must therefore live each day as firmly as when we first believed (Heb 3:13-15 NLT). Do we still believe in God as firmly as the day we first believed.

You may've been filled with excitement and hope induced joy for the future when you realise your life is not tied to any economy or government policies. Global / national events like the pandemic or the cost of living crisis are of no consequence. A day when nothing else matters. In a day, your own testimony is what matters. Step out and watch God meet your needs. So, what day is it for you?

Bottom line:

At times some challenges may seem overwhelming until God brings us through them. Therefore, everyday can be designated as a day of rejoicing because a day is what you name it (Phil 4:4).
