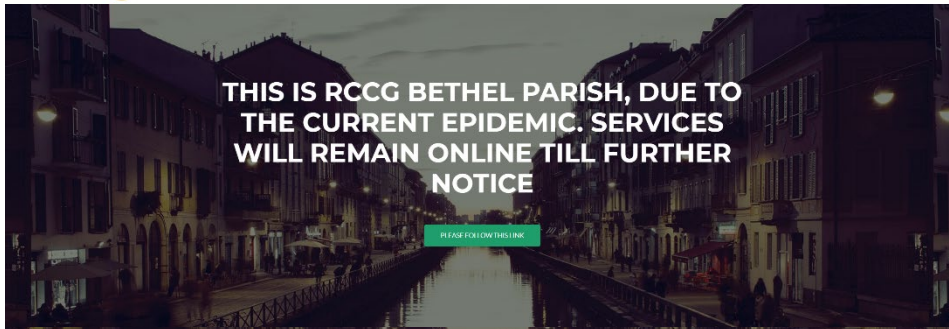

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A word of encouragement

Text: Isaiah 2:1-4

Isaiah began his prophetic ministry, in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz and Hezekiah, in the days of war, devastation and suffering. Yet, he envisioned a time when God's kingdom will be exalted and nations will stop fighting. It must've been an impossible picture for the people of his day and even now, we may find that scenario difficult to imagine.

In the scriptures, several went through similar times. Jeremiah was one of them and yet he was able to testify about the steadfastness of God's love (Lam 3:22-23; 27-31). Job was another. In the throes of unimaginable agony, he was still able to say "**...I will wait, till my change comes**" (Job 14:14; 19:25). Some of us may be going through some challenges right now. As Christian, we can never give up hope because things can change in an instance, even if it isn't as or when we want it (1 Cor 13:13).

We don't talk enough about hope. It doesn't disappoint (Rom 5:5; 4:18). God will never let us down and with God, all things are possible (Matt 19:26). Our appointed time may not be known to us till our change comes (Ecc 3:11). You may find yourself saying, even if he opens the window of heaven (2 Kgs 7:2). Hope is in the midst of our greatest suffering.

For example, people become rich or successful when they find solutions for problems, existing or new. Tough times will always come, but in the midst of them all, God will make a way (Isa 43:19). So, never give up on God. Like Jesus; our focus cannot be on the cross before us. We must see beyond it to the glory ahead of us (Heb 12:2; Jer 32:6).

Bottom line:

Where are you right now? Are you before or beyond the cross or right in the middle of some difficult times? Like God told Jeremiah, remember God's thoughts towards you are of good (Jer 29:11). Your change will surely come (2 Cor 4:17; Hab 2:2; Isa 55:10-11).
