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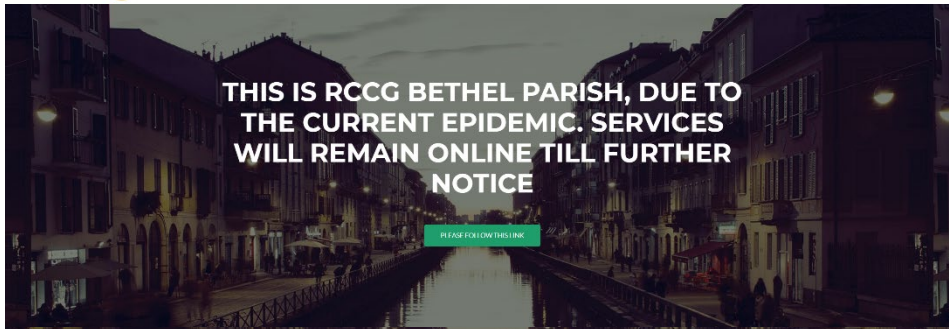

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The super power of trust in God

Text: Isaiah 26:1-4

Over time, there may be some scriptures that have been so impactful in your life you remember them often. Scriptures that speak to you in the darkest nights of your life. Such is our text for today. Many of us may desire to have super power. If you could, what would yours be? To fly, read minds, speak to people and compel them to serve God or teleport to faraway places?

In most cases, people choose the mind reading super power. It's the same with the power to control others. God is in ultimate control and know the end from the beginning (Isa 46:10). Yet, he chose not to exercise his control over us. Isaiah's choice is trust in the Lord (Isa 26:4). It may be easier to trust when we know intentions because trust is delicate; easy to lose and hard to recover.

On the other hand, it can be empowering to be trusted or believed in, especially for pupils or young people just starting to make their way in life. Many have received healing and salvation according to their faith (Matt 9:27-30). Where would you place your trust in God, on a scale of one to ten? When in crises and when things are going well, is the level of your trust constant?

Have there been times when you're scared, feel there's no way back or give up? Or do you find you trust God inexplicably at times, regardless of him showing up or not? Paul said God's "**invisible attributes**" so those who fail to trust in him are without excuse and defense (Rom 1:20).

Many of us lose trust in God when we feel he's disappointed us or delayed in responding to our request. Paul wondered who can know God's mind (1 Cor 2:16). Do you know God's plan for your life? God showed his mind to Jeremiah, which suggests Israel should know God's plan for them (Jer 29:11).

When God doesn't grant requests, chances are he may be sparing us a negative experience. Job never lost trust in God (Job 13:15). Neither did Isaac in his father and Abraham in God's ability to provide (Gen 22:1-18). Man may be unreliable, but we can put our absolute trust in God.

Bottom line:

God is trustworthy in all circumstances (Eph 3:20), because he's not bound by time or season. He has the power of eternity backing him up (Isa 26:4; Heb 7:23-25; Deut 33:26-27; 1 Tim 1:17). So, if he promises, he will do it (Isa 55:11).
