Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Pathfinder

Text: Isaiah 30:18-26

If at a cross road right now, Isaiah said our teachers will be able to guide us on the paths to take (Isa 30:20-21). As we grapple with AI systems and their capacity to learn from us as often as we use it, we may begin to see this in a new light. Right now, humans may be in control, but some have real fears that AI may dominate the world or replace us in time.

What do we do when we reach a stage and can't see any path forward or there's no way out from a difficult set of circumstances? Isaiah said we will hear a voice that tells us the right path. The scriptures recount how God led the Israelites out of Egypt through a longer route because he knew they weren't ready to face the Philistines (Ex 13:17-18).

This implies there may be battles we're unprepared for; blessings and opportunities that may require more from us than we can give at a particular point. Some may be experiencing difficulties now because they've taken the wrong paths (Prov 14:12). Only God can show us the way, tell us when the time's right and guide us through obvious / hidden threats along.

Those who are led by the Spirit are God's children (Rom 8:14). When God took the Israelites through the wilderness, he knew there were no travel-worn paths, support or provision along with many dangers. God forged the path, supporting, providing and protecting them (Psalm 23:4; Isa 43:16-19).

Jesus took this to a new level and told us we don't need a guide. He's the way (Jn 14:6). Joseph's life showed us how important God's guidance is. At every point in his life when all seemed impossible, God created a way of escape for him. Your path may seem unconventional. Wherever you are, God will create a way for you. You can never reach a dead end and God will never forget you (Isa 49:15). You need only one mentor and that's Jesus Christ.

Bottom line:

The Holy Spirit is alive and the same yesterday, today and forever. He knows everything and have all you need (Jn 14:15-18; 26). Go to God today, if you're feeling lost or confused. He's ready to guide (Isa 43:16-19).
