Google Chrome

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Solving life's problems

Text: Isaiah 30:27-32

Israelites have what we can call the Assyrian problem. Their latest enemy's fast becoming a super power, subduing and oppressing nations all around them. As expected, it was soon Judah's turn and it seemed an unsolvable problem when they received a letter of proposal from the Assyrians (Isa 36:1-13). How do you solve such a problem, when you're no longer in control?

Problems require solutions and they're a fact of life (Jn 16:33). So, don't let anyone promise you false peace, because growth is all about problem-solving. For example, God first had to solve the problem of darkness, creating light (Gen 1:3). Then, the problem of creation. And after man sinned, the sin problem also needed to be solved (Isa 9:6-7; Matt 1:21; 1 Jn 2:2).

Once a problem is solved however, grace is unlocked (Rom 5:20). The Israelites discovered a giant-sized problem when got to the Promised Land (Num 13:27-33). They felt like grasshoppers, next to them. Have you evaluated your own worth because of what others have told you?

We know the Israelites eventually entered the Promised Land (Josh 14:1-7), but they never resolved the giant problem (1 Sam 17:1-11). Problems never go away. They must be solved and sometimes, God places them our way to for resolution (1 Cor 10:13), making us a blessing to others in the process. That's how David solved the Goliath problem and went on to raise strong men who can kill giants too (2 Sam 21:15-22). Giants were no longer problems for the Israelites.

That may be why Paul claimed he doesn't fight like someone that shadow-box (1 Cor 9:26 AMP). Do you only shadow-box in the place of prayer, with non-specific requests? Do you just recount "*The Grace*" as a ritual? David understood what it means to have the Lord as his shepherd (Psa 23:1). Do you know God already prepared a solution before the Assyrian problem began (Isa 30:33 AMP; 36:14).

Bottom line:

Do you have the right perspective or are you still afraid of the giants? Do you see problems as promotions or dooms to destruction? Jesus knew how he was going to feed 5,000 before it became a problem (Matt 14:13-21). Problems can be opportunities for growth and blessings in this generation.
