Google Chrome

- Open the browser and the Settings menu (or the three vertical dots to the right of the menu bar).
- 2. Scroll down and click on Advanced Settings.
- 3. Select Open a specific page or set of pages under On Startup.
- 4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add http://rccgbethel.church/.

Mozilla Firefox

- Open Firefox. Press Alt-T on the keyboard and select Options from the drop-down menu or go to Tools >> Options from the main menu.
- In the Home section, select Homepage and new windows and Custom URLs... from the field's drop down.
- Enter or paste the URL: http://rccgbethel.church/ or click Use Current Page if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Faith, medicine and modern interventions: A Christian perspective on healing, life and ethical choices

Text: James 5:14

The scripture said the church is the ground and the pillar of truth (1 Tim 3:15b). In general, the church tries not to be too prescriptive about Christianity because no human being is infallible. No doubt we've heard of church leaders accused of one thing or the other. The scriptures also assures us that those led by the Spirit are sons of God (Rom 8:14).

Sometimes, we seek for validation of our thoughts and desires instead of listening for guidance from the Holy Spirit. Life is about perspective. It is often true that we can never know how we may react in certain circumstances. If both kidneys fail for instance and the daily struggle becomes overwhelming, our positions on organ donation may change (Lk 6:9).

Organ donations have saved many lives or changed the quality of their daily living. What about those unable to have children for one reason or the other? Do we condemn them for choosing IVF or surrogacy in those circumstances? Does that mean people who choose to lacked faith in God?

Cosmetic surgeries may be also frowned upon by some. But how different is that from the things we do with our hair, nails and other parts of our bodies so we can look beautiful or presentable in public? Antibiotics, painkillers and other medicines are also interventions, even if less invasive.

Often we justify what we do and condemn the same in others (Rom 2:21-22; Matthew 7:3-4). On the other end of the spectrum, we know godliness with contentment is great gain (1 Tim 6:6-7). We must ensure we remain sensitive to the will of God for our lives because our lives are in God's hands and the scriptures makes what should be our priorities clear (Psa 66:8-9; Matt 16:26).

Bottom line:

God created us in his image to have dominion over all things. We must also be aware that desperation and abundance of choices / advances in modern science often present dilemmas for us, but nothing must become a substitute for our faith and dependency in God. (Phil 1:21).
