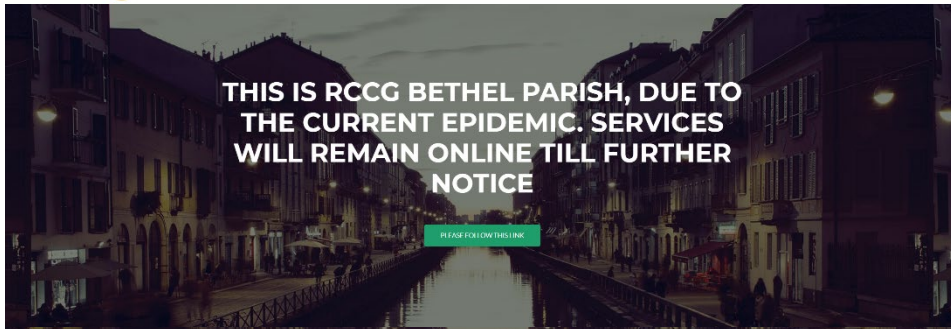

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.

4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Safety

Text: Isaiah 33:14-21

We started today, exploring what it means to call Jesus, **The Mighty God**. We've also been going through Isaiah for a while and may notice a bigger picture underlying the seemingly random / disjointed texts. The book seemed broken into two parts, the first is a build-up to an impending Assyrian attack.

The Assyrians were mighty and have defeated other great kingdoms, spreading terror wherever they went. Now they're coming against Israel. Understandably, some were terrified (Isa 33:14). One of the most terrifying things about war is siege and the subsequent hardships resulting from it. Yet Isaiah's speaking of victory, assuring them the land will not be invaded by the Assyrians.

Likewise, the enemy can put our lives under siege, perhaps through our finances or other means. We may feel surrounded, with no way out. However, the lessons to learn from this period Israel's history is that first and foremost, our safety is from God. No one can cross the boundaries he's placed around us unless God permits it and he won't unless it's for our good.

For one thing, Jesus told us not to fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul (Matt 10:28). That's because our soul is what matters. The will to succeed and achieve greatness is from God, not from our strength / intelligence or other means (Deut 8:18a). Therefore, we shouldn't live our lives in fear.

These days, we seem to lack the resilience to deal with disappointments, which leaves many living in constant fear and anxiety. We're so used to the fast pace of technological innovations that we struggle when anything doesn't go as planned / expected. Even when faced with overwhelming odds, we will still succeed. That includes the state of our health. Our wellbeing is not with NHS or the medical establishment and our finance is not about what we do or earn. Take care of yourself. Live healthy. But know they're all lay in the hand of the Most High.

Bottom line:

Understanding the source of our safety should mean we stop living in fear (2 Tim 1:7; Isa 41:10; 43:2; 26:3). The world is full of "Assyrians" and if we allow them, they will put us under siege. God is reminding us today he's surrounded us with a river of safety. No enemy can cross it or touch us (Isa 33:18-21).
