Google Chrome

- 1. Open the browser and the Settings menu (or the three vertical dots to the right of the menu bar).
- 2. Scroll down and click on Advanced Settings.
- Select Open a specific page or set of pages under On Startup.
- 4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add http://rccgbethel.church/.

Mozilla Firefox

- 1. Open Firefox. Press Alt-T on the keyboard and select Options from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools** >> **Options** from the main menu.
- 2. In the Home section, select Homepage and new windows and Custom URLs... from the field's drop down.
- 3. Enter or paste the URL: http://rccgbethel.church/ or click Use Current Page if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

- 1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
- 2. Select Settings and select A Specific Page or Pages from the Open Microsoft Edge With section drop down options.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Biblical parenting: Navigating parenting through different cultures

Text: Proverbs 22:6

Finding the balance between children respecting themselves and being respectful is a challenge. Each of us will have to find our own ways of parenting and methods used by our parents may not work. In the Western culture, children are taught to speak up while in other cultures, it is considered rude when children look at their parents in the eye.

Children will always test boundaries. Cultures, customs and social behaviours may influence and there are cultures in Scriptures too. For example, God was able to speak to how Abraham will raise his children (Gen 18:19). There are also books available on parenting. However, God's guidance is key, regardless of the underlying cultures.

Sometimes, careers or values imposed on children may be at odds with the educational system or their own wishes / desires. Ultimately, the word of God supersedes cultural norms or preferences (Psa 127:3-5). As parents, we must commit ourselves wholeheartedly to the word of God and ensure we're role models and good examples (Deut 6:6-9).

Children may depart a set path or disappoint for a spell. At those times, be prayerful and know God can redeem. If you don't have children yet, pray that you will be good parents able to bring up Godly children (Lk 15:11-32; Matt 16:26). God's word is our anchor. Culture differs, but our calling is to raise Godly children with the fear of God in them (Gen 18:19).

Some key points include making Christ the center of everything in the home and practicing what we say. Celebrate your roots and teach them your language. Practice open communication, build community and ask for help with prayers when struggling. Don't be rigid. Be open to other ideas. God is able to transform the lives of our children just as he did for us.

Bottom line:

Pray for God's help to be patient parents. Children need guidance. We must base our training on whatever will help children onto the right path, and to cultivate the fear of God in all they do.
