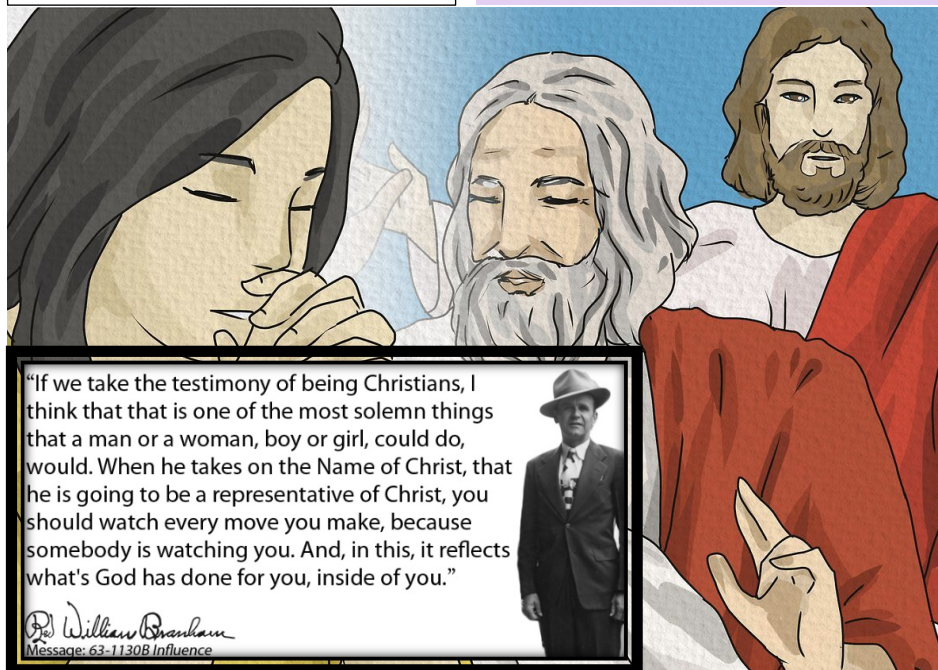

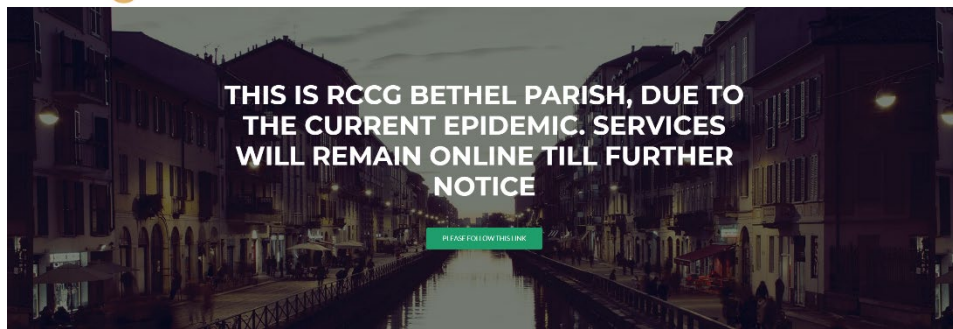

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The way of salvation

Text: Isaiah 40:1-5

There are three things necessary for the growth of a nation in terms of infrastructure. Peace and security is one, electricity's another and the third is good roads and transportation network. Our scripture today talks about this, setting a task for us. We're asked to preparing the way of the Lord (Isa 40:3).

John the Baptist prepared the way for the first coming of Jesus Christ (Lk 1:13-17). The analogy arises from the ancient times. When monarchs visit a place, heralds go ahead and prepare the way for them to pass through. Likewise, we're all called to make the way for salvation (Isa 40:9-11), because when someone goes ahead of you, success in a particular situation becomes easier.

Therefore, our lives may be preparing the way of salvation for someone right now (2 Cor 5:19-20). That's why we have to be careful how we live, because we never stop representing Christ, wherever we are and what we do can make it easier or difficult for others to come to Christ. We're the church, not buildings or locations.

As an illustration, let's take the church's name: Bethel. Do we know its story in the bible? The first Scriptural references talk about Jacob building altars in Bethel (Gen 28:16-19; 35:1-3). It was an extraordinary place that had a great impact on Jacob's life. But later, it became a place where gold calves are worshipped and Bethel was cursed (1 Ks 12:29; 13:1-2).

That suggests it's not how we start that matters. Consistency and finishing strong matters more. Any place can be a high place and / or a place of miracle when we make it so. How we choose to live our lives matter because we're called to be God's royal priests and to become carriers of God's dignity (1 Pet 2:9; Ex 28:2).

Bottom line:

Your life matters and how you choose to live it matters. When we make a way for God in our lives, his glory will be clear for all to see and he will give us opportunities to make a difference (Isa 40:3-5; Col 1:27; Jn 12:32).
