So, why don't you set our homepage as one of your **startup page(s)** in your browser now? The following instructions for most of the common browsers may help.

## Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

## Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

## Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### Emmanuel

#### Text: Matthew 1:18-23

These days, Christmas celebrations can take many forms. For us Christians, it should be a time of gratitude that Christ came to redeem us and bring about reconciliation between man and God (Lk 23:12). Our text today emphasises this and the book of Isaiah gave us practical implications of his coming (Isa 41:8-15).

God's ever present with us because he's Emmanuel (Matt 1:23). However, are we conscious of him? Psalm 23 suggests David understood perfectly. He knew God's ever close, wherever and whenever we are (Psa 23:4 NLT). He always hears us when we pray and always working to bring to pass his purpose in our lives (Jn 11:22).

When Christ came, he was the game changer. A few key benefits among many include safety (Mk 4:37-39). He's also given us direct access to God (Heb 4:16). He brings provision (Psa 23:1). He's our ever-present advocate before God (1 Jn 2:1; Lk 20:28; 2 Cor 5:9-11; Jd 12:24-25; Heb 7:24-25 AMP) and he brought us salvation.

Christ is a priest forever and he'll be right there alongside us when we appear before the throne of judgement (Heb 7:17). Therefore, our salvation is eternal, unbound by time and space. Thus, we needn't live as though we're helpless. Like a famous plaque says: **Christ is the head of our house... the unseen guest at every meal and the silent listener to every conversation.** We are never alone.

#### Bottom line:

Christ is Emmanuel: God with us, revealed in us. Therefore, we've nothing fear. Be conscious of that truth today and let it set you free (Jn 8:32).
