So, why don't you set our homepage as one of your **startup page(s)** in your browser now? The following instructions for most of the common browsers may help.

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The right / strategic prayer

Text: Nehemiah 1:1-11

This was Nehemiah's prayer before approaching King Artaxerxes for help to rebuild Jerusalem, and at the end, he asked God to grant him favour with the king (Neh 1:11). Sometimes we know God's plan and sometimes we're unaware of it. For example, God sent Elijah to the Widow of Zarephath to be fed. But the woman had a different plan; to eat her last meal with her son and die (1 Kngs 17:7-12).

Likewise, it's more than likely that God's plan for you is different from yours, but know also that every plan of God for man comes with a strategic prayer. Simeon and Anna were both praying to see God's promise fulfilled in their lifetime (Lk 2:25-32; 36-38). Anna fasted and prayed night and day for eighty-four years, since she was a widow.

Prayer's important, but what we pray about is even more crucial (Mat 6:7) The disciples must have learnt something from John the Baptists' prayer life when they asked Jesus to teach them how to pray (Lk 11:1). We need to be strategic because there are times we pray for things of no significance and ignore what really matters (Lk 19:42). James gave us a description of the prayers we need (Js 5:13-18 AMP).

As powerful as our prayers may be, they need to be strategic and directed to be effective. We can find an example in the book of 2 Samuel. David knew the only prayer he needed was against Ahitophel's counsel (2 Sam 15:31). This year, we must devote time to prayer, but they need to be strategic.

Pray for God to give you wisdom to pray the right prayers for the right reasons and things, because that changes everything. Don't pray useless prayers. When God opens your eyes, you can pray for things before they happen. For a church, asking God to give us the right people to build may be better than asking for growth.

Become friends with the Holy Spirit. As God revealed his plans or Sodom and Gomorrah to Abraham, there was a clear strategy in Abraham's request (Gen 18:17-33) and God knew what Abraham really cared about was to save his nephew, Lot (Gen 19:15-22; 29). Make a prayer plan and check it off as they're answered. At the end of the year, you may begin to see the direction your life's gone and realise nothing changes things like prayer in this life.

Bottom line:

Don't pray reactive prayers this year. Seek God's face so that you pray effectual prayers and do not pray amiss (Js 4:3). Pray for wisdom that you're not caught unawares and also to pray for the real need in your life.
