Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The right kind of help

Text: Nehemiah 2:1-4

Nehemiah couldn't hide how he felt before the king, which may've been risky (Neh 2:2). How often do we appear sad before the King of kings? Why are we not joyful all the time (Psa 16:11)? As it happens, God's willing to receive us as we are. The king was willing to help Nehemiah and he did. But there were some oppositions and they were displeased (Neh 2:9-10 NLT).

Real helpers should seek our wellbeing, welfare and prosperity without becoming another problem to us. Therefore, we need to pray for the right kind of help / helpers when we need it. Israel lost everything when sent into captivity, including skills and talents. So, they needed all the help they could get when returning.

God raised Zerubbabel, followed by Ezra. But there was no security without because the wall was not built. So, it was Nehemiah's turn. God gives us the ability to gather wealth and to remain in abundance over time, not deficit (Deut 8:18). Nehemiah could help because of the help the king gave him.

Sometimes we need to help unburden someone before our burdens can be lifted (2 Kngs 6:1-7) and God knew from the start we need helpers (Gen 2:18-20). A difficult journey could be sweet when there's help along the way, to strengthen one another. Organisations thrive and succeed when they have the right talent. We need the right kind of help to build (Exo 25:40; 31:1-11). Visions are great, but they can only be realised with the right kind of people.

Likewise, we're all here at this time because there's something we can do to help the church grow. When we put our skills set together and we can build according to God's pattern. We need someone to expand our understanding and raise the bar of what's possible (Psa 121:1-2). Help also comes in the place of prayer where God may reveal what's about to happen and prayer changes things.

Bottom line:

We will all need help at varying points to build and consolidate this year. Watch out and pray for the right kind of help when you need it. Your help will come this year in Jesus name to guide your every step.
